Bears Wins Fourth Straight Div. 2 Wrestling Tourney Title

MAYVILLE — Frewsburg captured its fourth straight Division 2 wrestling tournament title in the two-day, seven-team event at Chautauqua Lake Central School on Saturday. The Bears went 6-0 while Salamanca was second at 5-1 followed by Maple Grove at 4-2, Silver Creek at 3-3, Chautauqua Lake at 2-4, Cattaraugus-Little Valley at 1-6 and Cassadaga Valley at 0-6. Nick Mitchell, Dalton Scalf, Spencer Scalf and J. J. Marucci were undefeated and won at least two matches for Frewsburg. Ben Haas, Matt Metzler, Willie Yaworky and Jon Pierce were undefeated for Salamanca with at least two wins. Maple Grove had Leighton Caskey, Josh Micek, Andrew Apperson and Alex Smith going unbeaten with at least two victories. Don Cotter was 5-1 for Silver Creek with at least a pair of victories and his only loss came at the hands of Mitch Hoag of Salamanca who also went 5-1. Frewsburg defeated Maple Grove, 52-16, in the first round where Salamanca topped Cattaraugus-Little Valley, 48-21, and Silver Creek took care of Chautaugua Lake, 40-27. The second round had Frewsburg stopping Salamanca, 45-21, Maple Grove beating Chautauqua Lake, 38-27, and Cattaraugus-Little Valley prevailing over Cassadaga Valley, 36-15. Round three saw Frewsburg blanking Cattaraugus-Little Valley, 66-0, Salamanca defeating Maple Grove, 44-30, and Silver Creek beating Cassadaga Valley, 46-9. The next round had Frewsburg easily beating Cassadaga Valley, 60-9, Salamanca trimming Silver Creek, 55-9, and Chautaugua Lake beating Cattaraugus- Little Valley, 47-18. In the fifth round, Maple Grove took a 42-14 decision over Cassadaga Valley, Salamanca a 51-6 verdict over Chautauqua Lake and Silver Creek a 38-17 win over Cattaraugus-Little Valley. The sixth round had Frewsburg stopping Silver Creek, 55-5, Maple Grove prevailing over Cattaraugus-Little Valley, 45-23, and Chautauqua Lake over Cassadaga Valley, 42-12. The final round had Frewsburg defeating Chautauqua Lake, 54-6, for a perfect record while Salamanca trimmed Cassadaga Valley, 53-9, and Maple Grove stopped Silver Creek, 52-12.
