


1987 TOURNAMENT RECAP

As expected, Morrisville won the Region III Team Championship but the Mustangs got a real scare from Alfred State before pulling out a 4½ point win in what ended up being a 2 team battle for the title. Morrisville placed 4 in the finals and had 7 placewinners while Alfred surprised with 5 finalists and 8 placewinners. Alfred had 2 chances in the finals to win it all but Flowers (126) and Royer (142) prevailed against Alfred opponents Bannister and Galioto to nail down the title for Morrisville. Four schools were locked in a battle for 3rd and 4th as Monroe (3rd) and Niagara (4th) stunned #2 seed Delhi. Mohawk Valley was only 23/4 points behind the Broncos who placed 5th in the 9-team field.


Individually, Morrisville and Monroe each had three champions, Alfred - 2, and Niagara and Genesee - 1 each. The biggest surprise was a 177 where 5th seeded Emery Uvenio of Genesee defeated the 1st, 4th, and 2nd seeds to win his weight. Wulforst (190-Alfred) was the only unseeded wrestler to place. There were no repeat champions yet 6 winners and 26 of the 40 placewinners were seniors. Of the 30 national qualifiers, 19 were veterans and 11 were frosh. Two All-Americans, 4 national qualifiers, and 1 regional champ from 1986 failed to qualify in 1987. Three-way tie for O.W. first time in the history of the Region.

1987 Regional Champions-Morrisville







Runnerup - 1987 Alfred State




