

BATH | Bath Haverling earned an early lead and held it in a 40-22 wrestling victory over Wayland-Cohocton Thursday.

"I'm pretty happy with the guys," said Bath head coach Jim Fowler. "Overall, we wrestled well. The young kids wrestled pretty good and the older kids did good."
