## Mat Teams To Compete At College

First Annual Interscholastic Tournament Next Saturday.

CANTON, March 5.—Entries for the First Annual Interscholastic Wrestling Tournament of St. Lawrence University must be in the hands of General Chairman Roy B. Clogston by March 6. The matches will be run off according to National Collegiate Wrestling Association rules. The meet will be held on March 10, and gold medals will be given to the winners in each division with the runners up receiving silver awards. A trophy will be presented to the winning team. It is expected that 17 high schools will participate.

Trials will commence on March 10 at 10 A. M. The semi-finals will be held at 2 P. M., and the finals at 8 P. M. The St. Lawrence University band will give a concert just before the finals in the evening.

The coaches of the high schools will meet Friday, March 10, at 8 P. M. in the Common Room of the Men's Dormitory of St. Lawrence University for the purpose of drawing for places. This meeting will be under the supervision of Dean Edwin L. Halett.

M. B. Banks is the meet manager, and Arthur A. Stevens is in charge of the entertainment. The head of the finance committee is Ronald T. Burkman, and Robert Wellington is the publicity manager.

General Chairman Roy B. Clogston has named John Oliver of Springfield University, and Leslie Galit of St. Lawrence as the referees.

## LARRIE, TECH QUINTETS BOOK THIRD CONTEST

Play Deciding Game on Canton Court to be Played Wednesday Night.

CANTON, March 5.—For the first time in several years the varsity basketball teams of St. Lawrence University and Clarkson college will play a third game. The play-off will be staged in Brewer Field house here Wednesday evening.

Wry smiles lit up across the faces of many veteran fans who saw Clarkson trounce the Saints, 46 to 34, here on Friday. Both teams were on almost even terms in the first half, with Clarkson holding a three-point advantage. Fans were at a loss to account for the change in affairs in the second half when Clarkson riddled the Larrie defense to score 13 points in five minutes.

Such a change was drastic for a Larrie team, which had lost only to Colgate in a 16-game schedule, against a Clarkson team that had lost several games.

According to Larrie officials, the third game will have no effect on the Little College conference title. St. Lawrence has the title, since Clarkson was the only conference team to defeat the Saints. Clarkson lost once to St. Lawrence earlier and dropped another conference game.
