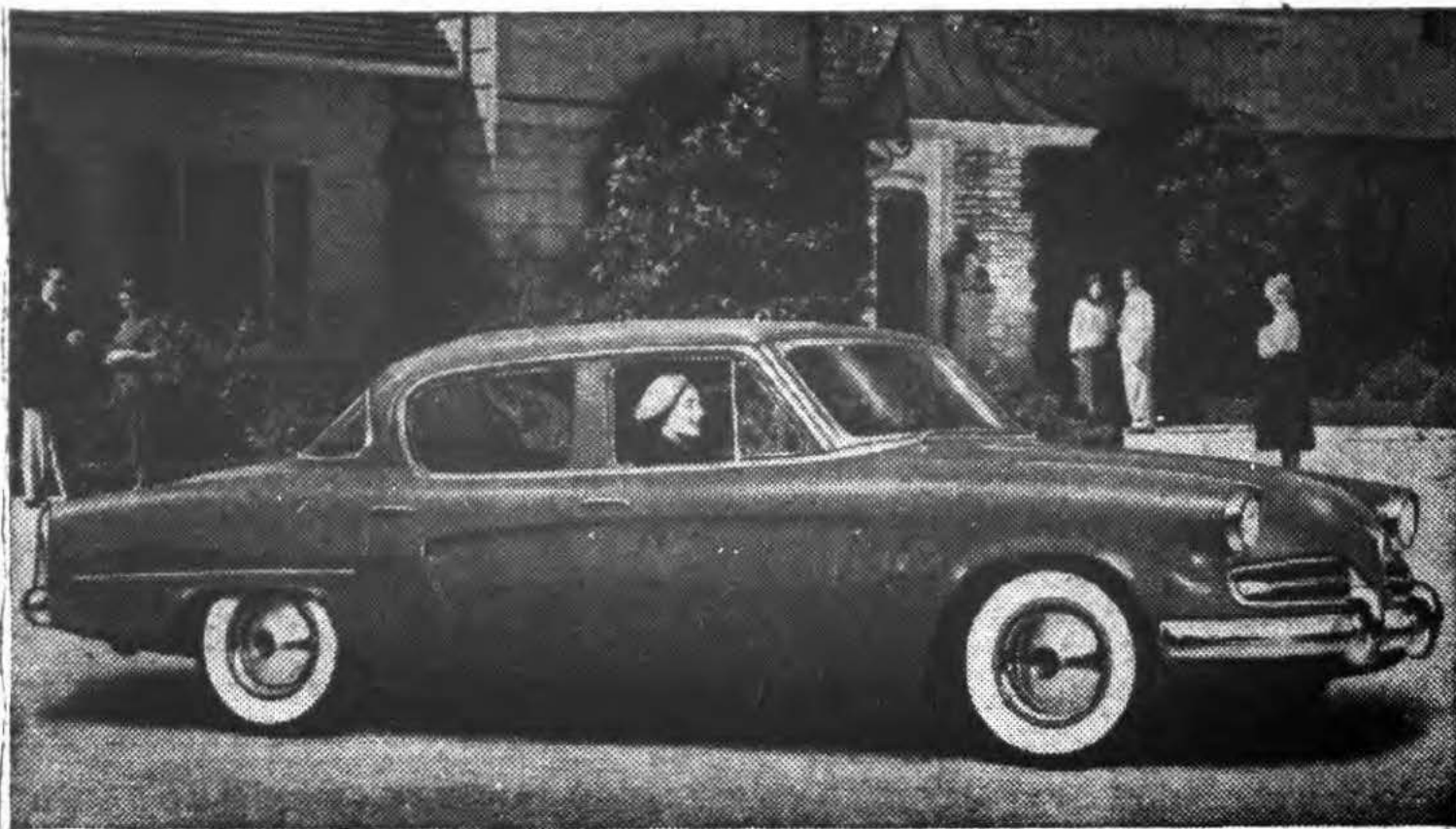


NEW STUDEBAKER MODELS ARRIVE HERE

Matmen Cop Section Title At West Seneca

Hamburg High School walked off with top honors in the Section Six interscholastic wrestling championships held at West Seneca Central School last Friday and Saturday. The winning score was 42 points.

Following Hamburg in point totals were West Seneca 38, and Orchard Park 37. Sectional championships follow: Class AA-Hamburg; Class A-Orchard Park; Class AAA-Amherst; Class B-Royalton-Hartland. Other scores in the meet were: Depew 28; Clarence Central 19; Amherst 5; Williamsville 4; Cleveland Hill 0. Park School, an independent entry scored 5 points.

Individual champions were declared as the result of the meet.

Hamburg came home with two out of the 11 weight class crowns. Gene Kempf, the Bulldogs' undefeated 127 pound grappler, and Lu-Ray Staff at 133 were the two Purple and White winners.

Finishing second for Hamburg were Dale Minard (145), and Captain Ben Lewis (165). Third place finishers for the local entry were Frank Reuter (112), John Marshall (120), John Derbyshire (138), Burt Berger (155), Jack Rutterman (175) and Bob Larson unlimited). George Callahan, who went to the mat for five matches, took a fourth place. His placement in the point scoring made it possible for Hamburg to score in every event.

Eden Bows To O. Park Score Is 81 To 50

Playing without the services of seven suspended regular varsity members, Eden lost an 81 to 50 decision to the league's second place Orchard Park.

During the first half the varsity squad, composed of regulars Ed. Cheney, Sam Sammarco, and Phil Vara, J.V.'s Wayne Finch, John Dempsey, played inspired ball with the powerful O.P. aggregation, averaging about 59% of their shots, gained only a three point, 40-37 lead at the half time.

In the third and fourth quarters, however, Eden ran out of gas and was unable to hold the opposition and gradually faded to the thirty one point loss. The first half was as spirited, if not more, as any seen in an Eden game in a long while. It was this spirit that probably tired the team out in the second half.
