Williamsville, Iroquois Are **Mat Choices**

Williamsville and Iroquols, champions of the ECIC's Divisions I and II, respectively, loom as the teams to beat in the annual Section VI wrestling championships which open two days of competition at Orchard Park and Falconer tonight.

The Class AAA and AA teams will vie at Orchard Park, while Falconer hosts the Class A and B schools. Both preliminary rounds get underway at 6:30, with semifinals set for 1:30 tomorrow afternoon and the finals at 7:30 tomorrow night.

Williamsville, after winning the Class AA title for the last three seasons, move up to AAA where West Seneca has ruled for two years. Iroquois, Class A champion last winter, has moved up to AA.
