

# Billies Win Mat Title

Williamsville, Iroquois, Gowanda and Casadaga Valley successfully defended their Section VI wrestling championships last night in tournaments that were held at Tonawanda, Maryvale, Salamanca and Silver Creek.

Williamsville won the Class AAA crown, Iroquois the Class AA title, Gowanda the Class A championship and Casadaga Valley the Class B crown.

The Billies grabbed six individual titles—John McKeever, 106; Dan Brown, 115; Dennis Eberl, 130; Doug Miller, 141; Al Worden, 148, and Mike Donohoe, 157.

McKeever, Brown, Miller and Donohoe were champions last year, also. Only other 1960 king to repeat was Amherst's Bob Jackson, at 123 pounds.

## Iroquois Has 6 Champs

Iroquois, in winning its third straight Class AA title, had six individual champions — Alan Leasure, 106; Harvey Schoenthal, 123; Ron Krane, 130; Ron Zielinski, 141; Bob Balcerzak, 183; and Jeff Bennett, heavyweight.

Schoenthal, Balcerzak and Bennett were Sectional champions last winter, also. Bennett scored three straight falls in the tourney to extend his unbeaten string to 44 matches.

Medina's Tom Dantley repeated at 115 pounds by handing Orchard Park's Tom Russell his first setback in three seasons.

Gowanda racked up five individual championships in gaining its third straight Class A crown. Gowanda winners were Lyle Boss, 115; Ed White, 136; Greg Ferry, 141; Don Holcomb, 157; and Ray Pachucinski, 183.

The feature match in the Class A competition was at 130 where defending champion Gerald Barton of Southwestern decided Gowanda's Paul Meyer, the 1959 king.

Casadaga Valley edged Silver

Creek by only five points to take home its fourth consecutive Class B title. Casadaga Valley had six champions — Howard Grimes, 98; Carl Lawson, 106; John Sharp, 115; Ted Anderson, 148; Ed Harvey, 157; and Ron Kent, 183.

Harvey, along with Cattaraugus' Doug Evans and Silver Creek's Ed Agliata, were successful in defending 1960 titles.

## Bucks Clinch Title

# Ohio State Beats Spartans, 91-83

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Unbeaten Ohio State clinched the Big Ten Conference basketball championship and an NCAA tournament berth by beating Michigan State 91-83 Saturday night.

It was the 29th consecutive win for the Buckeyes—23 this season—and 13th in the conference in which they have one game left to play. All other Big Ten teams have lost at least twice.

Ohio State didn't know it at the time but arch-rival Indiana made the clinching doubly sure by beating sixth-ranked Iowa, last possible contender for the conference championship, 78-69 at Iowa City.

Ohio State's final nine-point margin did not come close to showing how the Buckeyes dominated the game. It was close in the first half with Michigan State leading several times and the score tied 10 times.

The Buckeyes then zoomed away from their 43-39 halftime lead to outscore the Spartans 14-1 in the first four minutes of the second half. From there the Bucks rolled on to a 23-point lead, 72-49, before Michigan State began a last-gasp rally.

The Spartans whittled the lead to 73-62 but did not have time to make a serious threat.
