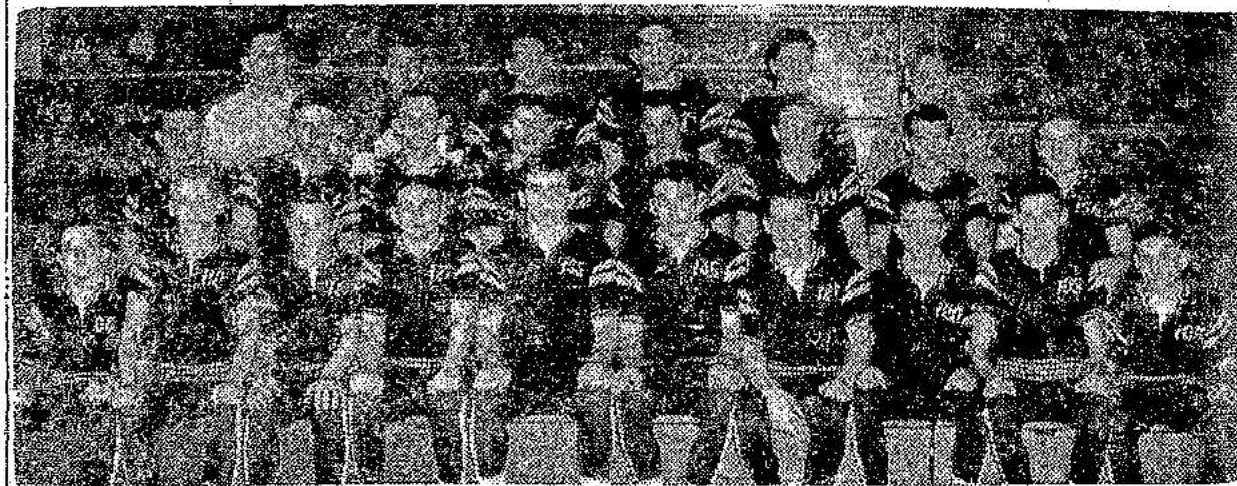


80 Wrestlers Entered in Tourney Here Saturday

Outstanding wrestlers from the squads of eight area schools will compete in the Section VI, Class B Wrestling Tournament Saturday afternoon and evening in the gym of the new Silver Creek Central School.

Silver Creek school wrestlers, winners of Class B, will be host to about 80 grapplers in the tournament which will be the first ever held in this village. The preliminaries will begin at 1 p. m. and the consolation and final matches will start at 7:30 p. m. Admission will be 75 cents per session.

Officials on the two mats to be used for the tournament will be Rod Galough of Gowanda, John Finley of Falconer and Ed Erikson of Buffalo. Erikson was 165 pound inter-

collegiate champion during his college career at Lehigh University and he is still active as an amateur wrestler.

Schools that will send wrestlers to compete are Alden, a new Class B entry; Cassadaga Valley, defending champions in the tournament and second to Silver Creek in Class B this season; Cattaraugus; Franklinville and Holland, where wrestling is a new sport this season; Pine Valley, Randolph and Silver Creek.

After the first round pairings were made this week, Coach Bill Ames of Silver Creek predicted several possible matches which should be of interest to spectators.

His predictions included Foxton of Silver Creek vs. Grimes

of Cassadaga in the 98 lb. class; Hohenstein of Silver Creek vs. Beckwith of Randolph in the 123 lb. class; Cross of Silver Creek vs. Doug Fancher of Pine Valley in the 141 lb. class; Smith of Silver Creek vs. Merrill of Cassadaga in the 141 lb. class; Harvey of Cassadaga vs. Parr of Randolph in the 157 lb. class; Agliata of Silver Creek vs. Isham of Alden in the 168 lb. class; Weaver of Randolph vs. Kent of Cassadaga in the 183 lb. class, and Link of Silver Creek vs. Priest of Randolph in the heavyweight class.

Last year, Silver Creek placed fourth in the Section VI tournament which was held at Southwestern. Agliata won the championship in the 168 lb. class.
