

Frontier, Iroquois, Gowanda Win Titles

Iroquois in Class AA and Gowanda in Class A last night repeated as Section VI wrestling champions, while Frontier's depth brought the Falcons their first Class AAA title.

The AAA meet was held at Frontier, AA at Lancaster and Class A at Eden.

Frontier had four individual champions—Paul Kaczmarek at 123 pounds, Jim Dunham at 130, Jim Stull at 148 and John Tyran at 183. The Falcons piled up points by also having three other wrestlers reach the finals before losing.

Two individuals successfully defended their Class AAA crowns. Amherst's Dave Steen held his 136-pound title by pinning Frontier's Dennis Dietrick, while North Tonawanda heavyweight John Zwolinski decisioned Cleveland Hill's Larry Macro.

The loss was Macro's first since being pinned by Zwolinski in last year's final.

Fourth Straight Title

Iroquois captured the Class AA laurels for the fourth straight year. The Chiefs were Class A champions in 1958.

Six Iroquois wrestlers won individual titles—Ron Krane, who was the only AA repeater at 130 pounds; Dennis Newell, 136; Don Malecki, 141; John Schroeder, 168; Cliff Walker, 183, and Hank Weil, heavyweight.

The biggest surprise in the AA meet came at 115 pounds, where Maryvale's Dick Nicotra decisioned Iroquois' Alan Leasure. 6-1. Leasure had beaten Nicotra twice in the regular season.

Gowanda crowned five individual champions en route to its fourth consecutive Class A title. The quintet included Wayne Mil-

ler, 98 pounds; Howie Gabel, 106; Lyle Boss, 123; Pat Gordon, 130, and Ray Pachucianski, 183.

Boss and Pachucianski were defending 1961 titles. Other repeaters were Chuck Grinols, Salamanca's 115-pounder, and Jim Overhoff, Eden heavyweight.
