

# Eden Wins Class 'A' Sectionals at Depew



Eden brought to a close their 1962-63 wrestling season by winning the Class A section VI Sectionals at Depew last Friday. Eden took top honors out of a field of nine schools by beating defending champion Gowanda by three points 96-93. Nine of Eden's 12 team members placed in the tournament.

At the start of the final matches, Eden had 25 points and had placed seven men in the finals. Gowanda also had seven men in the same position but had a total of 37 points team score.

Bill Bennett, in the 112 lb. class defeated previously undefeated Howard Gable of Gowanda. This was followed by Ron Enzers' first period pin of another Gowanda man in the 120 lb. class. In the 141 lb. weight class, Dan Graovac won a sectional championship by decisioning his opponent and in the 157 lb. class Ray Cagwi took a second place after an overtime match that to be decided by the officials.

In the 168 lb. class Gary Haag pinned Dave Burke of Southwestern in the first period, handing the latter his first loss of the year. Dick Minekime, the 168 lb. Sectional champion from last year, won the 183 lb. class by pinning his opponent from Gowanda early in the third period. John Szalasy, who defeated Starpoints' undefeated heavyweight earlier in the day, put the cradle on 230 lb. heavyweight from Southwestern and rocked him into a pin.

At tournament conclusion, Eden possessed six individual sectional championships plus the team tro-
