Section VI

Amherst, Iroquois Take Mat Titles

Amherst, Iroquois, Medina and Casadaga Valley are the kings of Section VI wrestling after having taken first place in their classes in the annual sectional tournaments Saturday evening.

Coach Gerry Wright's Amherst matmen, who soared to the ECIC Division I championship for the third straight year with a 15-0 record, took the Class AAA title at West Seneca.

The Tigers had four winners as they rolled up 82 points for their first sectional crown since 1955. Kenmore West gained the runner-up spot in a field of 12 with 63. Defending titlist North Tonawanda was third with 56.

Nick Kish, the class's only repeat winner, decisioned Curt Barry of Frontier to take the 183-pound championship. It was his 54th consecutive triumph. The Amherst senior's last defeat came in his first match as a sophomore.

Amherst's other winners were Henry Gullia (130 pounds), John Parkinson (157) and Alex Berger (168). Gullia won by a decision over last year's 123-pound champion — Tom Pokewaldt of North Tonawanda.

Cunningham Is Standout

Mike Cunningham, a Niagara Falls freshman, was named the tournament's outstanding wrestler. He pinned Dan Kathan of Williamsville for the 106-pound crown.

The triumph enabled Cunningham to complete the unusual feat of going undefeated in his first year of competition.

The top upset came in the 136-pound class, where non-seeded Dick Aquila of Hamburg decisioned favored Alan Moore of Williamsville for the title.

Iroquois Registers Sixth Straight Win

Iroquois copped the Class AA

championship for the sixth successive year, as three Chiefs won titles and another five reached final matches.

An overflow crowd of nearly 1,000, dubbed "the stormiest, most enthusiastic turnout I've seen in my association with public school wrestling" by the Iroquois coach, Norm Foster, witnessed the tourney at Iroquois' gym.

Iroquois, which amassed 106 points to runner-up Niagara-Wheatfield's 80, had these winners: Ron Rudich (106 pounds), Russ Brookman (123) and Tim DuMoulin (168). The Chiefs, winners of 114 straight dual matches, are the ECIC Division III champions, and Niagara-Wheatfield is the Niagara Frontier League title-holder.

Maryvale's Mark Kiesling was named the outstanding wrestler. His triumph in the 136-pound class was one of many upsets. The biggest surprise was DuMoulin's victory over Tom Rengert of Orchard Park in the 168-pound final.

Niagara-Wheatfield and Maryvale also had three first-place winners.
