

Lake Shore Host to Section VI Wrestlers



Lake Shore played host to twelve AA high schools in Section VI for their annual wrestling tournament last Friday and Saturday. A total of some 1500 people witnessed about 138 bouts in three different wrestling sessions.

Starting on Friday, March 1, at about 5:00 p.m., close to 144 participants began to arrive and weigh in to qualify for this tournament. Running from 7:15 p.m. until 12:30 a.m. Saturday, it made the 4 wrestling officials work like beavers handling something like 60 straight bouts.

Finishing at such a late hour, one team, Medina Central, decided to stay overnight in the building and sleep on some cots provided by the school.

On Saturday at 12:00 noon the remaining undefeated wrestlers and those who hadn't wrestled yet weighed in again, and another wrestling session ran from 1:15 to about 4:30 p.m. After some rest and a dinner the evening consolation (third- and fourth-place winners) bouts started and the session finished up with the last championship being awarded at 11:00 p.m.

Placing 5th out of twelve schools and having 4 wrestlers finish up in the semi-final and final bouts, coaches Steve Jaworek and Norm Backus were proud of their boys and the way they represented the school.
