



N-W Matmen Win Class AA Crown

Niagara-Wheatfield, the Niagara Frontier League champion, won the Section VI class AA wrestling title Saturday night.

Coach Armand Cacciatore's team, host for the competition, piled up 114 points to defeat defending champion Iroquois and 10 rivals.

Iroquois, which won the crown seven straight years and has a national record of 143 consecutive regular season wins, was second with 98 points.

Niagara-Wheatfield, which has captured the NFL prize for three successive years, is unbeaten in its last 48 regular season matches. All individual winners will compete next Saturday night at the Erie Tech Sports Arena.

The winners in each weight category will qualify for the New

York State intersectionals Saturday, March 5, at Walt Whitman High in Huntington Station, L.I.

Duane (Pat) Patterson's Iroquois squad, which won a Class A title before the AA string, was undefeated in 14 regular season matches this year for its ninth perfect campaign in a row.
