



Tigers Look Like Toledo Mud Hens

LAKE LAND, Fla. (AP) —
The world champion Detroit Tigers, looking more like the International League champion Toledo Mudhens, opened their 1969 spring training Saturday.
Only 17 players showed up and only one of them could be considered a name player.
Dick Radatz, currently on the Toledo roster, was the only player with considerable major league experience who was present. Altogether, 11 of the 17 were with Toledo last year.
The continuing owner-player

dispute has kept the rest of the squad away, although many of them have arrived in Lakeland.
About 100 spectators were on hand as the small contingent of Tigers rambled out of the clubhouse at Marchant Stadium and on to the field at 10:30 a.m. under cloudy skies but pleasant temperatures.
Among those present were eight pitchers, two catchers, four infielders and two outfielders.
Besides Radatz the pitchers present were Les Cain, Jim Foor, Mike Kikaenny, George Korince, Fred Scherman, Mike Small and Tom Timmerman, all rookies. All except Timmerman are on Detroit's 40-man spring roster.

The Falcons' 200-yard medley relay team of Werner, John Guthrie, Jon Lederhouse and Frank Gregov was fourth in 1:45.9 out of a field of 30 relay teams.

Lederhouse was seventh in the 100-backstroke and Guthrie 13th.
Overall team champion was Westfield, N.J. Kenmore West and North Tonawanda also competed in the meet but finished lower than N-W.

Brown, Hunt Take Titles

AMHERST—Dennis Brown of Niagara Falls and Willie Hunt of LaSalle were individual winners and Kenmore East retained its team title as the Section VI, Class AAA wrestling championships were concluded Saturday night.

Brown took the 130-pound title by default when his rival, Dale Etengoff, suffered a rib injury as Brown had him in a cradle. Brown is unbeaten in 19 matches this season.

Hunt, a sophomore who's only lost once, took the 168-pound title with a 15-10 decision over Rex Biscaro. He's 16-1 for the season.

Kenmore East totaled 96 points and had three individual winners — Tom Rust (141 pounds), Gary Kumm (148) and Rich Fiden, the football all-star lineman wrestling unlimited.

Jim Verrastro of Tonawanda, 98-pounder, was named the tournament's most valuable wrestler. He won 8-0 over Tony Guizzotti of Maryvale in a battle of unbeaten.
