NEW YORK (UPI) Professional Golfers Association's new idea to speed up play in major tournaments will be tried for the first time Thursday in the Florida Citrus

Joseph C. Dey, commissioner of golf, said the PGA will have twosomes instead of threesomes playing in the final two rounds of all tournaments co-sponsored by the PGA's tournament by the PGA' players division.

"It has been proven in major championships that play in twosomes speeds up competition by as much as 50 minutes," Dey said.
