



High School Wrestlers Vie On Sectional Mats Saturday

Class A, B Tournaments Slated At Gowanda And Silver Creek

Medina and Starpoint, visitors from the Northern lands of Niagara-Orleans counties, invade Gowanda Saturday pitting man for man against Gowanda and Southwestern, the hopes of the Southern Tier in Class A section wrestling.

Meanwhile, in Silver Creek it looks like an all-Southern Tier affair with Cattaraugus favored, Cassadaga Valley next and Randolph and Pine Valley thrown in for good measure.

This is the story painted by the seedings, drawn in each wrestling tournament last night.

McDowell, Burk First

Ten schools will compete in the Class A affair at Gowanda, 11 if you include Wilson who's sending one man to compete in the newly-formed unlimited field, 235 pound, and above. The seeding story shows three Medina and three Starpoint grapplers rated number one, two Southwestern boys picked on top and

one Gowanda and one Falconer led given the nod.

From Southwestern it's Delavin McDowell (98) and Jim Burk (168) with the go-ahead in the classes, while Tom Todaro (106), Gary Olson (130) and Jerry Todaro (183) each look second best. Falconer seeds Gary Lefford first among the top-drawer men, Gary in 136.

Also rated from Southwestern are Jerry Holmes (115) and Wally Ostrum (148) each third while from Falconer Tom Strain (123) and Chuck Butmah (148) each are picked fifth. Salamanca's Bob "Hayseed" Harris, unbeaten with 11 straight wins, drew a fourth.

Falk, Trojan Unlimiteds

Besides one first and five seconds, Gowanda claims three third-seeded grapplers in Jim Luke (98), John Skye (141) and Mike Green (168).

Falconer and Southwestern, along with Eden and possibly Wilson, are the only schools entered in the unlimited class, reserved for 235-pounders and above. This is a new class, only recently created.

Four Cattaraugus wrestlers have the nod in the B and C clash at Silver Creek. Three Cassadaga matmen are picked to fare first, two from Randolph and two from Pine Valley.

Here four men will be entered in the unlimited class, with Grand Island's Dan Walgate seeded first.

Lefford, Harris Unbeaten

In the Class A tournament, Gary Lefford of Falconer and Bob Harris of Salamanca are the last of the unbeaten, untied musclemen representing the Southern Tier. In the B tourney six boys boast top credentials. Unbeaten are three Big Red wrestlers, Bert Nagel, Larry Steinbar and Bill Prusinowski while Pine Valley's Chuck Stankey, Silver Creek's Ray Cross and Randolph's Ray Hoxie all have yet to taste defeat.

Both mat classics get underway at 12:30 with the consolations held on two mats beginning at 7 p.m. and the finals on one mat following the consolations.

JHS' Stockwell Draws Bye In Wrestling Meet

Jim Stockwell, Jamestown High's unlimited entry in the AAA Wrestling Sectionals at West Seneca today and Saturday, has drawn a bye in the first round.

The 260-pounder was seeded third in the newly-created unlimited field and will see his first action in the tournament on Saturday. He is 8-1 for the season with Jamestown's first year wrestling crew.

Besides Stockwell, Raider coach Norm Thomas has entered 136-pounder Dan Ryan (5-2) and 183-pounder Jonas Johnson (8-2) in the West Seneca battle.

This was the first year of active competition for both Stockwell and Johnson, and only the second year for Ryan. The competition is expected to be rugged for all three local challengers.

The Raider trio will weigh in at 3:30, with the tourney's first matches slated on the mats at 5 p.m.
