## JHS' Stockwell Wins Unlimited ★

**NORTH TONAWANDA** — Jamestown High netted 10th place in the 14 team Class AAA wrestling tournament here Saturday, bringing home one champion and just missing a second.

The Raiders of Coach Norm Thomas piled up 27 team points in a tourney won by Maryvale with 80. It was the first year of

“Jumbo” Jim Stockwell was the only individual winner coping the unlimited crown for the second straight year. Stockwell, a winner via a 23 second pin Friday night, repeated by pinning Tonawanda's Bob Ulmer in 23 seconds Saturday to gain the finals.

For the championship, he pinned Pete Jehrio of North Tonawanda, although it took him a little longer, 4:50.

Jonas Johnson, a 183 winner twice Friday night, decided Bob MacKenzie of Kenmore East 4-1 to gain the finals. Here he missed a decision over Maryvale's unbeaten Neil Bateman by four seconds, and what coach Thomas referred to as the “Upset of the Century.”

Bateman, only a junior, has won the Class AAA sectionals in his weight class every year out. His only losses in his career have come against Nick Kish, Amherst's strongboy of last season. He was 16-0 coming into the match with Johnson.

more firsts to pick up 75 points and first place. Southwestern tallied 72, good enough for second.

## Silvernail Winner Of Unlimited

The team trophy was decided on the last match of the evening when Falconer's Wayne Silvernail, wrestling for the last time before the home crowd, met top-seeded Ron Borst, Southwestern. A pin by Borst meant the championship for the Trojans, a decision meant a tie for the top and a loss meant second.

**Five Locals Win**

Borst never led in the match, while Silvernail picked up points on a near fall, reversal and escape to take a 5-3 win. Falconer finished third in the team standings with 59 points.

Five local boys took firsts all told. From Southwestern senior Ed Strom took a 12-2 decision from Starpoint's Bruce Greig, senior Jerry Holmes pinned Falconer's Carl Brigiotta in 2:57 and senior Paul Donner won a 3-1 squeaker from Alden's Calvin Phillips.

Following a scoreless first period, Donner took control in the second and rode the top-seeded Phillips the entire period. Donner reversed his rival with 1:41 left. Phillips picked up his only point with 15 seconds showing on a penalty point for stalling, while Donner picked up riding time.

Gary Radspinner, the only other Falconer champ, was the meet's biggest surprise. Unseeded and bringing a 3-6-1 record into the meet, Radspinner knocked off Dale John of Eden (7-7), Don Scales of Starpoint (3rd seeded), Tom Todaro of Southwestern (2nd seeded) and finally freshman Dan Drugg of Salamanca in the finals. Drugg too was unseeded.

**Six To Five**

Starpoint had the edge on the Trojans with six boys in the finals to five. The Pointers led 18-15 through eliminations, Southwestern took a 27-18 lead after the consolations and the Trojans led 65-64 going into Steve O'Malley's match, a must for the Niagara-Orleans club.

The closeness of victory was a matter of seconds when O'Malley, ahead 4-0, found himself on the bottom of a pinning combination with 50 seconds left in the second period, but Eden's Howard Stewart couldn't “hold that pose” and was quickly reversed and pinned.

Of the two Trojan-Starpoint matches, each team split. Phil Hurst came from behind to pin Lee Christensen in the 98 fray and Strom trampled Greig in 106.

The younger O'Malley also won in a match decided by seconds. Ahead 4-2 over Gowanda's top-seeded Ken Phillips in the third period, Phillips reversed the younger O'Malley but they rolled off the mats too quickly for the two points to count. Phillips escaped with 19 seconds showing, but could do nothing, losing 6-3.

**Cannon Loses**

A reverse with six seconds showing in the third period and a near fall at the buzzer gave Depew's Roy Altheide a 6-2 win over Falconer's top-seeded Ricky Cannon.

Falconer's Chuck Butman, second-seeded 157 pounder, was upset in the finals by Starpoint's fourth-seeded John Hey. Ahead 3-2 in the match, Butman was pinned with 1:45 remaining.

The only other Southern Tier grapplers in action, split. Tim Witherell of Gowanda lost to top-seeded Willie Aderman of Alden, 11-4. Unbeaten Bob “Hayseed” Harris of Salamanca upped his victory string to 20 matches topping Eden's Dan Cagwin 7-3.

Other Creekers in the win column were once-beaten Tom Carlson and Chuck Cornwall, whose only losses have been narrow decisions to Ed Strom of Southwestern.

Larry Steinbar, held to a draw against Falconer's Chuck Butman in a duel match, easily decided Rich Lucas of Pine Valley in the finals. Two-time sectional champ Dan Evans made it three straight with a pin over Carl Kelly of Holland, Cattaraugus' Bill Salisbury was heavy-weight champ.

Other county winners were Jim Lucas of Pine Valley, Rod Nickerson of Cassadaga Valley and Dave Scott of CV. Scott's only loss this season was to Silver Creek's Sam Crisanti in the Holiday Tourney final, so he avenged this setback in the sectionals.

Tom Butcher, a 15 year old sophomore from Pine Valley, copped his second tournament of the year following up his Holiday Tournament victory.

Runner-up to Oil City in the regular season Section 2-10 competition, Warren tallied only 42 points to 45 for Meadville, 50 for Corry and 55 for team champion Oil City. OC failed to field a champion, losing five finals matches.

Dick Thompson, Warren's fine 157 pounder unbeaten for the season, eked out a 5-4 win over arch-rival Jimmy Shaughnessy of OC. It was a repeat of last year's sectional final, also won by Thompson.
