Six Trojans Advance, Tied For Team Lead

FALCONER— Six Southwestern boys guaranteed the Trojans at least 18 points by making the semi-finals of the Section VI, Class A wrestling tournament here last night.

In the final round 10 points goes to a team for each individual win, seven for a loss. But by making the semi's a grappler is assured of at least reaching the consolation round, where five points is awarded for each win, three points for a loss.

The Trojans are tied with Alden, seven points each, after the first day's competition. Tonight the consolation matches will start at 7, the finals at 8. The eliminations this afternoon were begun at noon to allow more time for the evening round.

The elimination matches were completed up to the 157 weight. From 157 through heavyweight the quarter-finals will be wrestled today, along with the semi's.

Of the semi-final matches completed, the Trojans' six boys led all teams. Alden, Eden, Falconer, Salamanca and Starpoint all have four boys guaranteed to make at least the consolations.

Of the six "upset" matches last night, three involved Salamancans. Third-seeded Darryl

Johnson won his first match pinning Lockport's Mark La Roach in 2:51. Next he pinned Brian Brunner of Tonawanda, in 2:45.

Carrying a 15-1 record into the semi's, second-seeded Jonas

meets third seeded Bob MacMackenzie of Kenmore East today. MacKenzie carries an 11-2-1 record into the match.

Stockwell recorded the fastest pin of the tournament downing Pat Connor of West Seneca in 23 seconds. He goes against Mike Ulmer of Tonawanda today.

The only other Jamestown win was Dave Valone's 9-2 decision over Larry Bauer of West Seneca in the 123 class. Valone quickly lost to top-seeded Gary Slusser of Maryvale on a second period fall.
