Grand Island's top-seeded Dan Walgate pinned Gowanda's Kerwin George in 43 seconds of the unlimited finals, the seven second-place points picked up by George pushing Coach Ernie Bareham's club to an 84-82 margin over defending champ Star-

Top seeds who went all the way were Walgate, Les Chambers (98-lb.), Bob Edwards (106), and Frank Budway (123) of Grand Island, plus Jim Ellis (115) of Starpoint.

Ken Phillips added key second-place points to Gowanda's total while Loren Stafford defeated Sombers in the consolation to aid the Panthers' early chances. Paul Phillips garnered fourth-place points in the 106-lb. class.

It was the seventh sectional title for Gowanda and its veteran coach, Ernie Bareham, who has won 10 conference titles.
