At Ithaca Saturday ITHACA - Two Southwestern Central grapplers will be among the 13 Section VI wrestlers com-

peting in the third annual Interscholastic Wrestling ment of the New York State Public High School Athletic Association to be held here Saturday. Jerry Holmes (115) and Paul Donner (141) carry local hopes

into the 104 man tourney. Dan Evans (123) and Larry Steinbar (157) are the only other South-ern. Tier Wrestling Conference I grapplers going, representing i Cattaraugus. Holmes is unbeaten this season, 19-0-1 overall. He was held to a 1-1 stalemate by Larry Harrington of Corry. Jerry's a sen-

ior this year and a two-time section champ. Upset Wins Donner, the surprise of the inter-sectional competition, claims a 13-5-2 record going into the state finals. The unheralded sen-

ior pulled off two upset wins to gain a place on the Section VI team.

Evans of Cattaraugus is one of two repeaters on this year's all-section team. The Cattaraugus 123 pounder, one of the finest wrestlers ever at the Class C school, comes in with an 18-2 record. His only losses were in 130 pound competition to Silver

Creek's Raj Cross. Last year he lost twice in the state finals. Steinbar, the only junior of the four Southern Tier entries, is 20-0-1 for the year. He was held to a 2-2 stalemate against Chuck Butman of Falconer.

Niagara-Wheatfield 98 pound-Niagara-Wheatfield 98 pound-er Jim Printup is the only other repeater besides Evans. N-W also sends 106 pound Bob Stokes and heavyweight Rick Kowalik.

at the college here, with conso-lation bouts slated for 7 p.m. 7 p.m. and the finals at 8 p.m.

Section VIII of Long Island is defending champion of the tournament, having won it each year. Section VI finished third

last year. Best bets from this section are Evans, Bateman and Kowalik.
