

Braves win own tourney with depth

CANANDAIGUA—The Canandaigua Braves had only one individual champion, but used their depth to win their own 15 team wrestling tournament over the weekend at the Community College of the Finger Lakes gym.

The Braves picked up 132 points by taking a first, a pair of seconds, four thirds and four fourths during the tournament.

Glens Falls had two champions and finished second with 103 1/2 points while Lancaster, with the most champions, three, tied for third with Spencer-Van Etten, which had two champs. Both teams finished with 95 points.

Ithaca took fifth with 78 1/2 points, followed by Ossining with 75 1/2, East with 74 1/2, Chenango Valley with 72 1/2, Watertown with 67, with 66, Pearl River with 53, Hornell with 47, Wayne with 37, Brockport 36 and Irondequoil 35.

Ithaca and East each had two champions while Ossining had one.

"This was probably among the toughest competition of any tournament in the state," noted Canandaigua Coach Weldon Canough, who was pleased as his team won its third

straight tourney of the season.
