Iroquois Mat Streak Halted

The national victory streak record for high school wrestling teams was halted at 150 matches Tuesday at Attica handed Iroquois its first setback in 10 years, 25-16, at Iroquois.

Attica, Wyoming County League champion four of the last five years and 8-0 this season, gained an 18-6 command but did not clinch the decision until junior Howie Bird pinned Bob Valentine in the heavyweight finale.

The loss ended a skein that began with the 1957-58 season inaugural and drew national wire service mention last Feb. 8 when a 26-16 win over Grand Island bettered the longest previeus streak on record.

That was the Chiefs' 141st in a row. It erased the mark set by Appalachian High of Boone, N.C. The streak reached 143 last season and 150 Friday night, when the Tribe beat Grand Island again, 26-18.

"Give them all the credit." Iroquois Coach Pat Patterson said. "They deserve it. I was disappointed, but we did our best. We just faced a better team."

Patterson is in his second season as Iroqueis pilot. He succedded Norm Foster, who coached the first mat team there in 1956-57. That was the sport's only team at the Elma school to lose a match (it lost three) before Tuesday.

Mike Abt, who has never lost in a dual match and whose only career setback came in the State quarter-finals on Long Island last year, remained Iroquois' only unbeaten member. He pinned freshman Steve Bird (Howle's brother) Abt, a junior, has a 31-1 career mark.

Iroquois still is unbeaten in the ECIC's Division III.

The Chiefs are aiming at their 10th straight division title. They won eight straight sectional crowns before Niagara-Wheatfield dethroned them in Class AA last year.
