

Paladino, Buckley and Jackson
Capture Championships

On Saturday, Caledonia played host to the Livingston Co. Class "B" pre-quarter sectionals. Caledonia did quite well, ending up with three members winning their weight class. This enabled the winners to participate in a meet at York on Tuesday.

In Saturday's match, Strano, Caledonia's 95 lber, finished 4th. At 103, Paladino (CM) wrestled three matches, winning the first two by pins and the championship by a decision over Copeland of Livonia. Greg Buckley (CM) is the champion in the 112 lb. class. Greg won the championship by beating Vanbuskirk of York in the finals.

Randy Stephenson of Avon was the winner in the 120 lb. class. Randy met Dan Reid, who gave him a real workout. Dan finished third.

Dan Blaker, CM 127 lber, finished third, behind Ray Ruliffson of Geneseo and Cicero of York. Bakus of Livonia dominated the 133 lb. class. Bill Paladino (CM) wrestled for the injured Steve Roberts and was defeated in his first match.

Mike Miller was defeated in his first match in the 138 lb. class. Dempsey of Geneseo was the champ. Ron Miller wrestled Kemp of Livonia in his first match in the 145 lb. class. Ron met Hilderbrant of York and was defeated by a decision. Hilderbrant was the 145 lb. winner.

Casey Ruliffson of Geneseo wrestled Henry Cobb of Caledonia in his first match on his way to the championship in the 154 lb. class. Henry finished third with a pin over Pease of Livonia.

Ron Roth looked like he was out to win the 165 lb. class for Caledonia. Ron won his first two matches by pins in the first period. Masterson of Livonia still hadn't forgotten being pinned by Roth in the county tournament. Masterson beat Ron in the finals for the championship. In the 180 lb. class, Jackson had three pins to walk away with the championship for Caledonia. Two of his pins were in the first period.

Heater of Caledonia finished 3rd in the Heavyweight class, behind Durkee of Livonia and Pragle of Geneseo.

This match set the stage for the quarter finals which were held at York Tuesday night.

QUARTER FINALS AT YORK

A large crowd watched as the Livingston Co. "B" champion team overpowered their Monroe Co. counterparts, 43-8, in a meet at York on Tuesday night. This meet decided participants who will be in the match to be held on Saturday at Brockport.

In the 95 lb. class, Bruce Stevens of Avon won a very tight match against Ron Meyer of Churchville-Chili. In an overtime period, Stevens won a 7-6 decision.

Caledonia's Dan Paladino at 103 lb, continued his winning streak by capturing an 8-3 decision win over Myron Lemperie of Honeoye Falls.

Another Caledonian, Greg Buckley, at 112, won by a pin. His opponent was Tom Moore of Churchville-Chili.

Randy Stephenson of Avon won the 120 lb. match against Jim Moran of Honeoye Falls, by a 13-0 decision.

At 127, Ray Ruliffson of Geneseo won a 5-2 decision over Dave Thompson of Churchville-Chili.

Tony Backus of Livonia, won by an 8-0 decision over Henry Goebel of Honeoye Falls in the 133 lb. class.

Bill Dempsey, 138 lber. from Geneseo, pinned Rod Redman, of Churchville-Chili.

Bob Hilderbrant, York's only entrant on the Livingston Co. team won the 145 lb. class by a pin over Jim Volkmuth, C-C.

Monroe County's first score came when 154 lber. from Churchville-Chili, Dick Moore, won a 14-5 decision over Casey Ruliffson of Geneseo.

Kevin Masterson, 165 lb., from Livonia pinned Bob Wieland, C-C.

Caledonia's third entrant was Jim Jackson at 180. He won a 7-0 decision over Marty Buckwald of C-C.

John Durkee, Livonia's heavy-weight, pinned Ron Gruendike of Churchville-Chili.

Monroe Co. "B" team's only other score came when David Junco of Churchville-Chili, in the unlimited weight class, won by a forfeit, as he was unopposed.

The final team score was Livingston Co. B team - 43; Monroe Co. B team - 8.

Winners in each weight class will compete in the Section V semi-finals and finals at Brockport State Teachers College on Saturday (Feb. 24) beginning at 11 a.m.

Also, on Saturday, the winners of Class B will wrestle the winners of Class A.

The final champ at each weight class will compete in the State Intersectional Meet to be held on March 1 and 2 at the Onondaga County War Memorial in Syracuse.
