Pre-quarter Section Five Wrestling Tournament

This is the Pre-quarter Section Five Wrestling Tournament, which determines the representatives for the Class B Livingston County Team participating in the Section Five Tournament. There will not be any trophies awarded, but the winners will go up the ladder to the Quarter-Finals of the Section Five Tournament to be held at York Central School on Tuesday night, February 20, beginning at 7:00 P.M.. The winners of that meet go to Brockport State Saturday Feb. 24 to determine the Section Champions of both A & B schools. This year for the first time there will be a wrestle-off between the A champs and the B champs.

Quarter-finals and semi-finals start at 1:00 P.M.

Consolations and finals start at 6:30 P.M.

T. Scoring Team Points.

First Place in each weight class shall count ten points, Second Place seven points, Third Place four points, and Fourth Place two points. These points shall be awarded as soon as earned. At the conclusion of the championship semi-finals, each winner shall receive seven points. At the conclusion of the championship finals, each winner shall receive three additional points, each loser no additional points. At the conclusion of the consolation semi-finals, each winner shall receive two points. At the conclusion of the third place matches, each winner shall receive two additional points, each loser no additional points. One additional point shall be scored for each match won by a fall throughout the tournament.

II. Match Point Score System.

- A. Takedown-Whenever a contestant brings his opponent to the mat and gains control while supporting points of either wrestler are within the wrestling area. Two points are awarded.
- B. Escape-When the defensive wrestler gains a neutral position, in which neither wrestler has control, while the supporting points of either are within the wrestling area. One point is awarded.
- C. Reversal-When the defensive wrestler comes from underneath and gains control of his opponent either on the mat or in a rear standing position while the supporting points of either wrestler are within the wrestling area. Two points are awarded.
- D. Predicament-A position in which the offensive wrestler has control
- E. Near Fall-A near fall is a position in which the offensive wrestler has control of his opponent in a pinning situation with both shoulders or the scapula area held in contact with the mat for one full second or when one shoulder of the defensive wrestler is touching the mat and the other shoulder is held within one inch or less of the mat for two full seconds. Three points shall be awarded for these situations.
- F. Time Advantage-The offensive wrestler who has control in an advantage position over his opponent is gaining time advantage. A timekeeper assigned to each wrestler records his accumulated time advantage throughout the match or a multiple timer may be permitted to record the time advantage. At the end of the match the referee subtracts the lesser time advantage from the greater. If the contestant with the greater time advantage has less than one minute of net time advantage, no point is awarded. If he has one full minute of net time advantage, but less than two minutes he is awarded one point. If he has two full minutes or more, he is awarded two points. No contestant may be awarded more than two for time advantage in any one match. The contestant with the lesser time advantage receives no points even though he accumulates several minutes of time advantage position.
- G. Fall -Any part of the shoulders or area of both scapulas held in contact with the mat for two seconds constitutes a fall. One team point is awarded and the match ends at this time.

Today's tournament is the first part of the Section Five Tournament. It determines the Livingston County "B" representatives. No trophies are given, but the winners will have the opportunity to compete further on in the Section Five Tournament.

Some feel that the Pre-Quarters are a sort of "anti-climax" to the preceding County Tournament, but as many champions of the past have found, "Over confidence can kill you." Through this tournament "true" champions are tested not only once, but twice during the season. Let's look at the perspective weight classes and see how each sizes up.

In the 98 lb. class Stevens of Avon pulled off an upset in the Counties. Will he stay on top or will Nettman of Livonia decide it's his turn, along with Strano of Caledonia thinking the same?

At 105 a job may be at hand for Paladino of Caledonia. The surprise may come from Copeland of Livonia or possibly Sweeney of Mt. Morris.

The 115 lb. weight class will prove to be very exciting. The winner here will truly be a champion. But also there is the question - who will it be - Buckley of Caledonia, VanBaskirk of York, or even Seltzer of Mt. Morris?

At 123 the weight class seems to be stacked. Will Stepenson of Avon keep his status or will it be taken over by Stevens of Nunda, Wingate of Livonia, or Reid of Caledonia? Each of them gave you unwanted trouble, Randy. Who will it be?

The 130 lb. weight class is dominated by Ray Muliffson of Geneseo. Will it remain dominated?

The 136 lb. class seems to be sewed up by Backus of Livonia. Are the stitches tight enough, Tony?

At 141, Dempsey of Geneseo is the odds on favorite, but will others follow in John's footsteps?

Hildebrandt of York would be anyone's choice at 148 lbs. Will he remain anyone's choice.

The 157 lb. class does not seem stable and may be taken by anyone. Is Shaw of Avon ready to hang on?

In the 165 lb. class it seems to be a game of question for Roth of Caledonia and Masteron of Livonia as to who really owns the weight class. The answer will be given today.

At 180 Jackson of Caledonia is on top. Is the season taking you out, Jim, or will Kime of Avon, Englert of York, or Cartwright of Nunda take over where you are.

The Heavyweight division will possess some excitement. Durkee of Livonia would seem to be the favorite, but Cragle of Geneseo may like to be on top or even Heater of Caledonia. Remember the match you had with him in the Counties.

All in all, most likely those seeded will win but don't count on a sure thing because in wrestling there is none. To all competitors today, we wish you the best of luck, but remember.
