Little Portville Central School made it five straight Class BB-B titles in Section 6 (5 WNY counties) wrestling Saturday and rammed home a telling point to the bigger schools.

It was in the team scoring of the BB-B action at Franklinville, with Portville outdistancing second place Maple Grove - the co-champ of the Southern Tier League - by 109 points to MG's 70.

Meanwhile, at Medina - in the Class BBB sectionals -Salamanca was nipped by Medina for the team title, 69-to-63, after the Warriors had taken the first day lead. It was Salamanca's finest finish in the sectional wrestling.

At Williamsville North High School, Olean High managed only 16 points, "but," noted an observer of the wrestling action in Western New York, "this is the first time Olean has shown anything in wrestling. They finished with three boys winning consolations, something they had never accomplished."

Inter-Class 6 Section championships will be Saturday at Niagara-Wheatfield Central School. State championships will be March 13th at Syracuse's War Memorial.

PORTVILLE'S WIN

FRANKLINVILLE - The Most Outstanding Wrestler crown in the BB-B action at Hoyer of East Aurora, and 148

Franklinville eluded big winner Portville as Cattaraugus Central's Dave Forester decisioned Portville's Garry Pollack in winning the 170 pound title.

Portville had captured five of the titles going into that match and the loss was the only setback coach Bob Klucik's team suffered in the title bouts. Last year, Portville had advanced 10 into the Section 5 inter-class action but emerged with only one winner.

Portville's Mark Hannon, making his record 22-0 for the season, was the default victor over Maple Grove's Dave Marinelli in the 135 pound title bout. "He (Marinelli) suffered a broken tooth and cut his tongue," Klucik explained, telling of the default. "It was a disappointment to all of us, for Marinelli had gone into the bout with 20-0 record. This was the big bout for us."

SALAMANCA: 2 CHAMPS

MEDINA — Two Salamanca grapplers won Sectional Class BBB titles, including Gary Milanowski who made his record 21-2 with 6-2 decision over Falconer's Bill Ognibene. Other Warrior to capture title Saturday night was Mike Ciolek who was 16-8 decision victor over Jack Galbreath of Cassadaga Valley.

Four of the five Salamanca boys in the consolation bouts triumphed including John Nolan (101 pounds), Jim Scherrer (122), Dave Jimmerson (158) and Jeff Davis (heavyweight). Consolation loser was Jim Williams.

Ed Williams, of Allegany, made his record 18-4 as he pinned Salamanca's Fred Boser in 3:35 to win the 177 pound title. Allegany's John Crisafulli was 3-2 decision loser to Medina's Knight in the 145 pound division title bout.

Cassadaga Valley's all-round athlete, Craig Segerlin (victor in 167 pound class) emerged as the MVP of the tourney. Milanowski's victory made it

WELLSVILLE: BUCHHOLZ

DANSVILLE Buchholz, winning the 180 pound class, was Wellsville Central School's only winner in Section 5 semi-final Class AA-A wrestling championships here Central Saturday. Bath emerged with three champions while Corning West, Attica and Dansville each captured two titles. The winners will compete in next Friday's Section 5 (10 western, Central NY counties) Class AA-A championships at Geneseo State College.
