

Section 3 Second in Wrestling

Four Area Schoolboys Win Titles

A quartet of area athletes—Jim Rosecrans of West Genesee, Eric Bratt of Westhill, Don Langenmayr of Liverpool and Stu Gillette of Indian River—earned individual state

championships at the Intersectional meets Saturday.

In wrestling at the Onondaga County War Memorial, defending state champion Section Three powered to another good showing, taking second

place with 72 points, led by winners such as Rosecrans at heavyweight, Bratt at 177 pounds and Gillette at 138.

The husky Rosecrans, a three-sport star for the Wildcats, decisioned Joel Puleo of

Iroquois Central (Section Six) by a 12-2 score in the title bout. Bratt outpointed Jim Hohman of Pearl River (Section Nine) by 11-3 in another exciting title bout and Gillette handled Rory Houlihan of Niskayuna (Section Two) by 14-10 in his rugged championship match.

Section Three also received a second-place from amazing freshman Dan Hunt of West Genesee at 112 pounds, thirds with Jerry Jacobson of Fulton at 98, Dale Porter of South Jefferson at 145 and Dave Remick of Whitesboro at 167 plus a fourth from Bruce Jantzi of Lowville at 155.

Hunt, who was loudly-applauded by the 4,400 fans in attendance Saturday has been the biggest surprise of Section Three wrestling this year. As an underdog in match after match during the past three weeks of eliminations, he won every time before finally succumbing to the veteran Ivan Gonzales of Brentwood in the title match, 5-2.

And, Gonzales had to battle with all his skill to hold off Hunt's last-period rally.

Langenmayr, a sophomore sensation this year for unbeaten (39 straight) Liverpool, won the 100-yard butterfly event with a time of 53.8 seconds at the swimming Intersectional meet in the RIT pool at Rochester. Langenmayr's local arch-rival, Mickey Webb of Jamesville-DeWitt, was a close second in that event.

Section Six (Buffalo area) again won the state swim title, with Section Eight the runnerup and Section Three third.

Another third-place finish was provided by the Section Three gymnastics squad, which competed at Schenectady's Niskayuna High school. Top local individual effort was posted by Henninger's George Sabotka who was second in the parallel bars and sixth in the all-around standings.

Paul Freistadt of Cicero was third in tumbling, Pete Nestico of Cicero was fourth and Matt Levy of Fayetteville-Manlius was fifth in the trampoline, and Bill Eklund of Cicero was fifth in the rope climb.

Also, George Barth of Baldwinsville placed fifth in the horizontal bar event, Dave Menzer of Jamesville-DeWitt finished sixth in the parallel bars, and in the side horse, Pat Denero of Henninger was third and favored Greg Collis of Nottingham slipped to fourth.

The annual Section Three track meet was won by defending champion Liverpool (Class A) and Onondaga Central (Class B). The field events were staged Saturday and Liverpool high jumper Mark Heistand was a standout, clearing 6-5 to set a new Section Three indoor record. The long jump went to John Barmonde of Onondaga Central with a 19-9 3/4 effort.

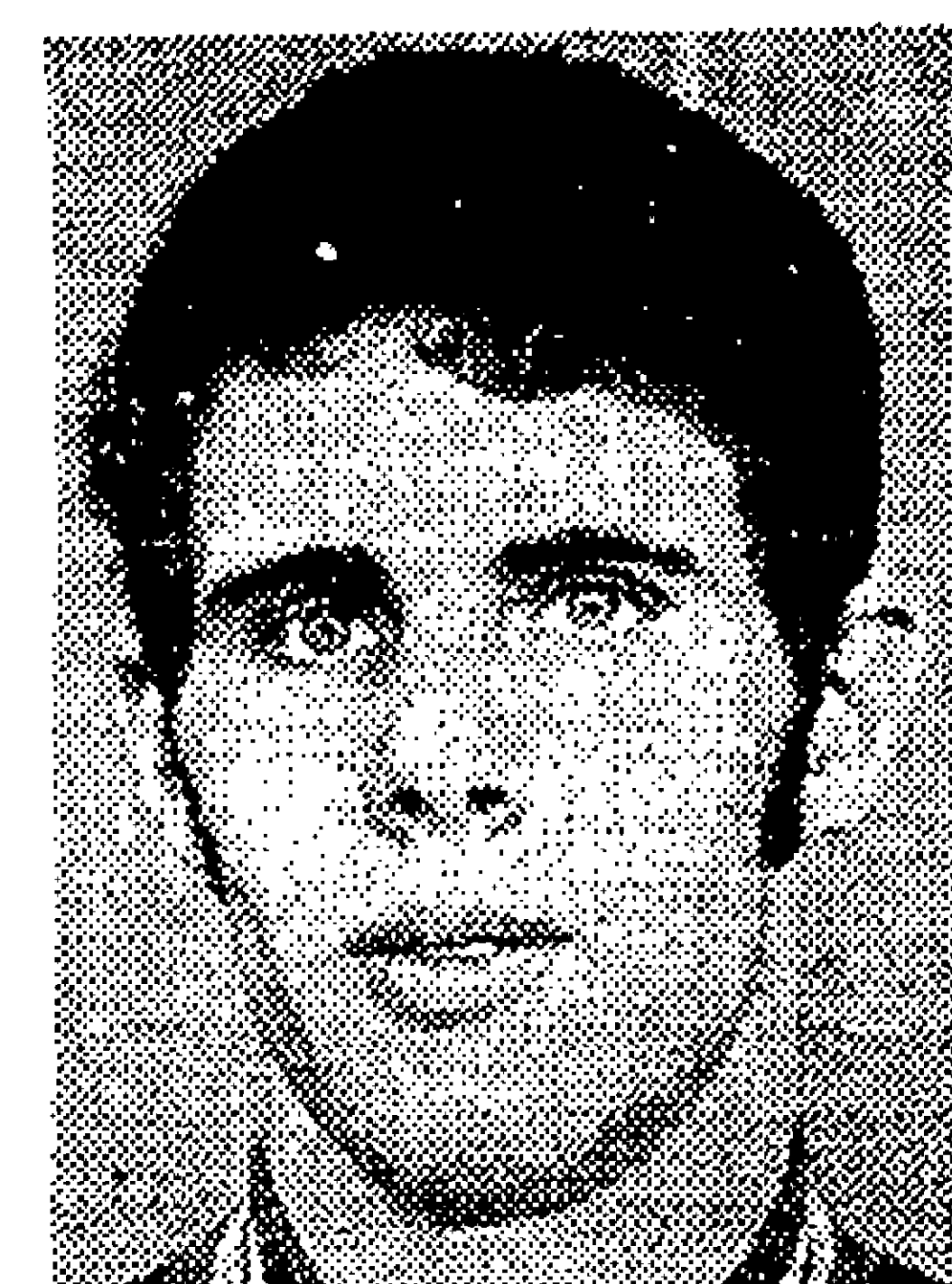
Intersectional Notes—Section 11, led by Brentwood's three champions, won the wrestling event with 82 points . . . Brentwood, the state's best team, had three firsts, a second and a fourth, the best-ever team finish in state competition . . . Most outstanding wrestler was John Cuyler of Elmira Free Academy, winner of 51 straight bouts and two straight state titles, at 138 and 145 pounds.

BOSTON (AP) Don Nelson led a third-period blitz Sunday as the Boston Celtics struck from behind with 15 straight points in 2 1/2 minutes and went on to a 117-104 National Basketball Association victory over the Chicago Bulls.

Nelson, who led all scorers with 36 points, came back into the game with 8:45 to go in the period and the Celtics trailing 60-58. The veteran forward hit seven points in a row within 60 seconds to put his team in front, 65-60, and Dave Cowens and John Havlicek continued the surge to hike the count to 73-60.
