



# Andrews, Moulton, James in Inter-Sectionals

Potsdam Central School's three champions in the Section X Tournament held last weekend will be competing the Inter-Sectional Championships to be held in the Syracuse War Memorial this weekend.

Marty Andrews, Danny Moulton and David James will be among the 12 champs representing Section X in the tournament. This is the first year that Section X officials have allowed the member schools to participate in the Inter-Sectionals. The move to allow participation was, according to PCS wrestling

coach Jack Daniels, a "big step for sports in the North Country."

Action in the Inter-Sectionals will begin Friday night at 7 p.m. and the final day's action on Saturday will begin at 11 a.m.

Potsdam wrestlers placed men in seven the finals but were unable to defeat powerful Massena. This was Potsdam's best finish ever and for the first time Potsdam advanced more than three men to the finals.

The order of finish was Massena first with 106 points, Potsdam second with 97, fol-

lowed by Gouverneur with 83, Canton 74, Madrid-Waddington 47, Ogdensburg 46, Hermon-DeKalb 34, Norwood and Clifton-Fine each with 22, Malone 18 and Brushton-Moira 17.

Marty Andrews, 122 lbs., won his third tournament of the season by defeating Norwood's LaShomb, Canton's O'Horo and decisioning Gouver-

neur's Conrad Felix.

Danny Moulton, 155 lbs., came alive in the tournament and defeated Brushton-Moira's highly rated Laclair, Massena's Coughlin and OFA's Ives. Moulton missed being named "Outstanding Wrestler of the Tournament" by just one vote.

David James, 135 lbs., became a champion by defeat-

ing Hermon-DeKalb's Powell, Gouverneur's Ward and Massena's Coughlin in overtime.

Frank Keleher, 101 lbs., and Marty Fadden, 108 lbs., were both runners-up. Both are first year wrestlers and according to coach Daniels have "done an outstanding job." the two of them have a combined total of 31 wins this
