

Matmen head for Syracuse

PLATTSBURGH—Thirteen Section VII wrestlers head for Syracuse today to compete in the 1971 New York State Intersectional Wrestling Tournament.

The Peru Central Indians, coached by Stan Riggs, will be sending seven grapplers to the state meet. Closest team to that total is Brentwood High School from Section 11. They will have five members of their team heading to the meet.

Pairings for the state were released this week and show some of the local wrestlers seeded one step away from the semi-finals.

David Daniels of Beekmantown, wrestling in the 98-pound class will clash with Robert Sloan of Niagara-Wheatfield on Saturday. Sloan is undefeated in 23 matches while Daniels carries a 12-1 record into state competition. He decisioned Barry Rock of Peru, 10-4, to advance to Syracuse.

Richard Trombley of Northern Adirondack, winner in the 105-pound class, received a first round bye and will play the winner of the John Szkelnik, Robert Marchink match Saturday. Szkelnik of Geneva sports a 19-0 mark while Marchink of Walt Whitman holds a 9-4-1 record. Trombley is 9-4-1 and decisioned Peru's Jim Adams for the championship.

At 112 pounds, Paul Rock, 7-2, of Peru takes on Ed Chambers of Madrid-Waddington of Section 10. Chambers has won 11 matches while losing five this year. Rock pinned Saranac's Mickey Vann for the Sectional title.

Bill Dominic of Northern Adirondack, undefeated in 19 matches will wrestle Saturday the winner of the Doug Bissill-Doug Thomas match. He received a first round bye and needs one win to advance to

the semi-finals. Bissill of Madrid-Waddington stands 13-6 on the season while Thomas posted a 19-2 record. Dominic pinned Beekmantown's Ray Devins for the Section 1 119-pound championship.

Saranac's Ron LeClair will wrestle Tim Granowitz of Massapequa today. LeClair holds a 13-1 state while Granowitz was 21-2 on the season in Section 8 competition. LeClair decisioned Terry Daniels of Beekmantown for the section crown at 124 pounds. Mike Ashline of Au Sable Valley battles Mark Hannon of Portville on Saturday in the 132-pound match. Hannon, undefeated in 25 matches comes from Section 6, while Ashline sports a 12-3 mark. He decisioned Ken Parrish of Saranac for the sectional crown.

Mike Bonville of Peru, one of three undefeated wrestlers from the Section 7 tournament, received a first round bye in the 138-pound competition. Tim Tiernan, 8-1, of Madrid-Waddington and Stu Gillette, 24-1, of Indian River battle today for the right to wrestle Bonville Saturday. Bonville decisioned Dave Holdridge of Au Sable Valley for the Sectional crown.

Tom Everett, who decisioned John LeClair of Beekmantown for the Sectional title, received a first round bye in the 145-pound class compe-

tion. Everett, undefeated in 20 matches, will face the winner of Section 2 on Saturday. John Cuyler of Elmira Free Academy, who won the state crown at 138 last year, now wrestles at 145 pounds. Cuyler, from Section 2, has won 48 straight matches over a two-year period.

In the 165 pound class, Joe Duprey of Peru, 14-3, will wrestle Jim Horvath, 24-1 of Ramapo on Saturday. Duprey edged past Ron Charette of Northern Adirondack to win the sectional crown. Duprey's teammate Mike Kivett will face Dave Remick of Whitesboro Saturday in a 167-pound match. Kivett, who stands 17-2 on the season and entered the state meet by decisioning Jerry Tourville of Northern Adirondack, will wrestle Remick, who sports a 22-1 slate.

Peru's Harry Duprey will face undefeated Jim Wulf of Lancaster today in a 177-pound clash. Duprey moved to the state meet by decisioning Paul Allen of Plattsburgh High. Teammate Gene Ayotte faces stiff competition as he clashes with Steve Burrell of Oswego today. Ayotte holds a 20-1 record this season, but Burrell holds a perfection slate in 25 appearances. Ayotte successfully defended his 215-pound sectional title

this year by pinning John Doner of Au Sable Valley.

Bob Trudeau will represent Section VII's first entry in the unlimited weight class today as he takes on Mark Tyndall of Madrid-Waddington. Tyndall was 15-4 on the season while Trudeau, wrestling in the 215-pound was 11-5. He decisioned Tom Bourgeois of Peru, 1-0, to gain a state wrestling berth.

The meet starts tonight at 7:30 at the Syracuse War Memorial on Harrison Street off Route 81. Section Three is the defending champion, but Sections 8-11-4 are reported to be strong.
