

# Academy Wrestlers Win 6th Eastridge Tourney

ROCHESTER — Rolling to an unprecedented 102 points the Canandaigua Academy wrestlers won the sixth annual Eastridge Holiday Invitation Wrestling Tournament, Friday at Eastridge High School.

This marked the second tournament won by the Braves in a week as they copped the Spencerport Tournament Dec. 21.

Host Eastridge was second with 58 points; Pioneer Central, 57; Spencerport, 47; Iroquois, 37; Bishop Kearney, 36; Irondequoit, 35 and Webster, 13.

The Braves emerged with three individual champions. Jerry Case won the 95-pound crown; Don Langdon the 120-pound and Don Jones the 133-pound.

## Other Finalists

In addition, Canandaigua had four other finalists in Gary Gustin at 112 pounds; John Miller at 127 pounds; Tom Reed at 138 pounds and Don Mandrino at 165 pounds. These boys all lost their final matches and finished as runners-up.

Third place finishers who won the consolation rounds were Bob Connelly, 103 pounds; John Morrice, 145 pounds and Si Jackson, 154 pounds. Tom Rother lost his consolation match, finishing fourth.

Jim Hunt was pinned by Randy Rook of Spencerport in the quarter-final round. This was Hunt's first varsity start this year having been sidetracked most of the season with illness.

Mike Seranoffsky of Iroquois was declared the most outstanding wrestler and also received the trophy for the quickest pin times.

## Trophy Won Early

The Braves had the team trophy clinched after the semi-final round when they had piled up an unsurmountable lead, 86-48, with seven men in the finals and four in the consolation rounds.

In winning the 95-pound crown Case had three straight pins. In the opening round he pinned John Green of Arcade at 3:19; in the semi-final round he pinned Paul Sturgis of Irondequoit at 4:17 and in the finals he pinned Dick McIlhenny in 5:42.

With the Spencerport Tournament, Case is now working on five straight pins.

Langdon, the outstanding wrestler at Spencerport, copped his second tournament win with a pin and two decisions. In the opening round Langdon pinned John McMahon of Iroquois at

1:03; in the semi, Langdon decided Don O'Connell of Bishop Kearney, 5-1, and in the finals he decided Roger Bubel of Spencerport, 5-4, the identical score he beat Bubel for the Spencerport crown. This time Langdon was out front all the way.

## 1st Tourney Win

Jones came through with his first tournament win as he copped the 133-pound championship. In winning the opener, Jones decided Tony Germano of Bishop Kearney, 7-3; in the semi he pinned John O'Connell of Irondequoit at 3:17 and in the finals he decided Roger Geil of Iroquois, 8-0.

Gary Gustin, winner of his quarter - final and semi - final matches, was leading Mike Seranoffsky 4-0 when he latter cradeled Gustin and pinned him at 3:01 of their match.

John Miller also a finalist lost his final to Bill Holland of Irondequoit on a heartbreaking 4-3 decision. Holland had a take-down but Miller reversed and it was 2-2 after one. Miller got a penalty point in the second period for a 3-3 lead but Holland had an escape and a point riding time to get the win.

## Close Matches

Tom Reed also lost a close 4-3 final match to Tom Scalzo of Eastridge. Reed had a pair of pins going into the finals.

Don Mandrino, CA's other finalist, was leading Ron Tojdowski of Pioneer when he got caught and pinned at 1:13 of the first period.

The Braves will host Eastridge Jan. 11 at 8 p.m. at the Senior High gym.
