

Sweet Home, Williamsville also score

NW's wrestlers win crown

Niagara-Wheatfield, Sweet Home and Williamsville North wrestling teams Saturday won team championships over the weekend in Section VI wrestling.

The Falcons won the AA, Sweet Home 4-A and Williamsville North the Triple-A.

NIAGARA-WHEATFIELD's perennial wrestling champions did nothing to alter their top caliber rating in the Double-A Sectionals Saturday at Grand Island

The Falcons placed seven individual winners and wound up with a total of 141 points in the runaway win. The closest rival was Grand Island with 60 1/2 points while Olean had 50.

Two of the Falcon champions remain unbeaten with Bob Sloan in the 108 pound class and Ray Barry in the 170 bracket. Also winning individual titles were Terry Eisenman at 122, Bob Koshinski at 141, Tam Pittman at 158, Pat D'Amuro at 180 and Chuck Schmidt 250.

NW has won four straight Niagara Frontier titles and piled up 59 straight dual match victories. Kevin Hunt of Williamsville South was named the tourney's most valuable. He won the 129-pound title. Finals' summaries:

SWEET HOME'S Panthers scored a total of 65 team points to win the 4-A division with Maryvale six points off the pace in second place. Larry Yorke, Don Tiburzi and John Coughlin won individual titles for the champs who last year won the AAA title before moving up this season. Coughlin took Most Valuable honors. He twice has been a sectional winner and Saturday beat previously unbeaten Vince Tunda of Frontier in a close battle.

Kenmore West's Marty Grisanti made his record 20-0 and won the 141 class crown while North Tonawanda's Don Solack also made it 20 straight wins by taking the heavyweight crown.

Bob Pennington of Niagara Falls won in the unlimited division over Mark Potaczala of Kenmore East by default. Potaczala suffered an arm or wrist injury and forced to leave the match in the final period.

WILLIAMSVILLE NORTH was the winner in the closest Sectional battle of the weekend. The Spartans, placing five class title holders tallied 101 points while runnerup Tonawanda High scored 97 1/2 points. The Red Warriors had four champions including the tourney's most valuable wrestler.

The Spartans had champs in Dave Parsons, 98 pounds; Bob Bedell, 112; Rick Heim, 119; Mike Caulfield, 126, and Greg Worrell, 138.

Tonawanda had title wins by John DiBiase, 132; Sam Williams, 145; Bob Sanders, 155, and Pete Grumsha, 250.

DiBiase was the most valuable award winner and got his toughest competition from teammate Williams. DiBiase won the title in 1969-70 and 1970-71 seasons while Williams now has won the title three straight years. Grumsha is the defending champion in the unlimited bracket. Williams had three pins, the most in the tourney.
