



Four HCS Matmen Win In Albion Meet

Intramural wrestling was started at Holley Central on an elimination basis, with the school champions representing our school in a three way meet at Albion on Thursday, March 12. Kendall and Medina, both new schools in wrestling, were there. Kendall came out on top, taking six victories, followed by Holley with four. Medina came in last, scoring only two victories.

Holley's winners were: Frank King-dollar in the 112-pound weight class; Lloyd Tipton in the 133; Del Draper in the 138; and Norm Hefle who took the 145 class. These boys went to Batavia Wednesday night, March 18, to wrestle in the G.-O. county quarterfinals. In this meet, all schools who have wrestled and are in Genesee or Orleans county may enter.

Cadet Coach Don Matties from Brockport State Teachers College has handled all of the wrestling at Holley and was in charge of running off the intramural program. Mr. Matties, whose home town is Rochester, was graduated from John Marshall High School in 1949. In school he starred in track, football, and wrestling. In college he is outstanding in football and track.

The remainder of Holley's matmen who wrestled at Albion were: Oliver Jenks, 95; John Welker, 127; Don Knapp, 155; and Albert Blank, 165. Don Knapp and Albert Blank were both injured and unable to continue, so lost by default. Lloyd "Phoney" Tipton also received a minor arm injury but managed to continue and eventually pin his opponet.
