## Busy weekend is on tap in three high school sports

High school sport fans will be busy chasing around to witness post-season events this weekend as basketball, wrestling and swimming work their way toward climactic endings in Section VI.

Niagara Frontier Basketball League champions Kenmore West are scheduled to go against Amherst High School, cochampions of the Erie County Interscholastic Conference (ECIC), Division I, in the opening round of the Class AAAA Sectionals at North Tonawanda High School's neutral court tonight at 7:45.

Another NFL team involved in the AAAA Sectionals will be Niagara Falls. They take on Sweet Home tomorrow night at 8:45 at Erie County Community College.

In AAA games, Tonawanda High School faces division champion Lackawanna (11-1) at John F. Kennedy High School in Cheektowaga tomorrow at 7:45 p.m. Lockport will play West Seneca at 5:30 p.m. tomorrow at the same spot.

Niagara-Wheatfield, the league's only representative to the Class AA tourney, will play Kensington of the Yale Cup League Saturday at Amherst at 7 p.m.

A pair of the pre-tourney Class A favorites will meet Saturday afternoon at 3:30 at Amherst as Trott meets Depew.

Competition begins tonight in the Section VI wrestling tournament at Sweet Home High School to determine representatives to the state Inter-Sectional meet in Utica War Memorial Auditorium March 9-10.

Thirteen unbeaten wrestlers, all individual class champions, will see action beginning tonight at 6. Saturday's semi-finals begin at 1 p.m. The consolations start at 7 p.m. tomorrow, with the finals following.

Four NFL wrestlers are among the 26 undefeated going

into the meet. They are Greg Grimmer (26-0) and Jim Briggs (27-0) of Niagara-Wheatfield, Peter Grmusha (14-0) of Tonawanda, and John Elsberry (19-0) of LaSalle.

Grmusha wrestles in the unlimited class. Briggs is in the heavyweight class. Grimmer faces another undefeated matman in the 145-lb. class. (He is Tim Miller of Portville with a 25-0 slate.) Elsberry wrestles in the 132-lb. class.

Niagara-Wheatfield's Fred Rudolph established a 200-yard individual medley mark of 2:07.9 last night in qualifying meets for tomorrow's Section VI swimming championships at Buffalo State's Kissinger Pool.

Rudolph also swam the first leg for the Falcons' victorious 400-yard free relay team. Bob Nichols and Leander Patterson. other N-W swimmers, took firsts in the AA competition last night.
