

The Call of Spring Heard at Hobart

DESPITE SMALL NUMBER OF MEN LEFT IN THE COLLEGE, SPORTS WILL BE BOOMED—SQUADS OUT FOR LACROSSE AND TRACK

With a sizable squad out for the first lacrosse practice of the year, a squad of men out for the relay team which will enter a Buffalo meet, and several wrestlers getting ready to form a team to meet a team from the local Y. M. C. A., Hobart College athletics are at present very active.

The first practice for the predominant spring sport at Hobart, lacrosse, started yesterday afternoon with a squad of 14 men out for the team. Stickwork will be perfected in the gymnasium from now until spring, when the weathers lets the men get out on the campus again. Only one man in college, "Doc" Carr, is a former varsity man in lacrosse, due to the fact that the spring schedule of all sports was cancelled last spring. Much aptibility for the game is shown by several candidates for the team.

Coach Loman is an old Hobart star at lacrosse, so he will be able to give the new lacrosse men a great deal of helpful instruction. Yesterday afternoon, he had them working at shooting goals, with a marked out goal at one end of the gymnasium to shoot at.

At the first tryout of candidates for the relay track team, held Monday

afternoon, six men turned out, and another one will be out. Since only four men will be needed for the team, the Hobart coach regards the prospects as being very bright. On Monday afternoon, Hanson, Carr, Kober, Dietrick, Rumbold and MacNeil were given tryouts on the running track. Howe will come out later. Short dashes, including the 100, and 220 yard dashes, were tried out by the men at the first workout. This work is all in preparation for the relay meet in the 74th Regiment armory of Buffalo on March 2nd.

In wrestling, several Hobart men are daily "roughing 'em up" in preparation for a meet which will be held at a Hobart smoker on March 9th, when the college wrestlers will meet a team from the local Y. M. C. A.

When the college men go to the mat with the representatives of the Y. M. C. A. they will find that they will need all the holds and turns which Loman has been able to drill into them. The Y. M. C. A. team will be coached by "Marty" McHale and with his experience and knowledge of the game the material at the association is sure to be shaped into a first class team.
