

Seader to Participate in Hobart Wrestling Debut

Sammy Seader, Hobart junior, who captained the Hobart football team and won nation-wide fame last fall for his part in Hobart's sensational win over Rochester, will be a feature performer as Hobart's newly formed wrestling team makes its debut tonight in the Hobart College gym against the matmen of the local Y. M. C. A. at 8 o'clock.

Seader, as Hobart's only entry in the heavyweight class, will be one of Hobart's main hopes in the series of bouts to take place tonight when the Orange and Purple boys will enter their first mat competition against the experienced locals.

Hobart's colors in mat competition have been held, but the closeness of some of the decisions still leaves some doubt as to what members of the squad will appear tonight.
