



Eleven Schools Signed Up For Mat Tournament

CANTON. March 12.—Entries in the second annual interscholastic wrestling tournament, sponsored by St. Lawrence university, closed Monday afternoon with 11 schools signed up and two others. Norwich and Whitesboro expected to sign.

Nine of these schools will send full teams—Chateaugay, Van Hornesville, Franklin academy, of Malone, Ogdensburg free academy, of Ogdensburg, Canton, Little Falls, Alexandria Bay, Woicott and Dean academy of Gouverneur, Cranberry Lake and Goeymans high schools, each sending from two to four wrestlers.

Mark B. Banks, general chairman of the tournament committee, announced that Raymond Aso of St. Lawrence and John Oliver of Springfield will referee the matches.

The qualifying round of matches will be held Friday afternoon, March 15. The Saturday schedule includes quarter finals in the morning, semi finals in the afternoon and finals in the evening.

Coaches of all teams taking part in the event will be entertained by the university athletic department in the mens' dormitory Friday evening. The wrestlers will be entertained at a moving picture show in the dormitory.

HIGH SCHOOL BOXERS MEET HERE TONIGHT

Seeking another victory, the Ogdensburg Free academy boxers will compete in their fifth league match at the O. F. A. gym tonight at 8. The invaders, Oswego high will rank as favorites as a team, while the locals will have several strong individuals to possibly eke out a victory.

Oswego will have a number of veterans on their team in Baldwin, Breckenridge, Attwood and Healy, with the newcomers being Verdolina, Toscano and Dowie.

Ogdensburg has two veterans in Baker and Pierce, with newcomers in Scott, Fahey, Locketti, Kinch and Sutherland.

Oswego is strongest in the heavyweights, 165, 155 and 145 lb. classes, with fair possibilities in the welter and lightweights, while Ogdensburg has shown the most strength to date in the 105, 125, 145 and 155 lb. classes.

This contest brings together some of the finest boxing ability of Ogdensburg and Oswego and both teams are fighting hard in an effort to get in position and condition to jar the league leading team, Fulton, from the top position.
