



School Wrestlers To Enter Mat Tournament At Canton

The O. F. A. wrestling team will enter the tournament this Friday and Saturday at Canton in competition with the grapplers of Little Falls, Alexandria Bay, Gouverneur, Van Hornesville, West Carthage, Colymans and Canton. The local matmen won the plaque in the St. Lawrence University interscholastic tournament last year and is favored to do so this year.

Coach Kleemier, coach of the State Streeters, has whipped his matmen into condition and hopes that they take all honors in this year's tournament. The quarter finals of the tournament will be held Friday, the semi-finals Saturday and the finals Saturday night. A large crowd of enthusiastic spectators are expected to witness these exhibitions of wrestling skill.

The weights are arranged from the 95 pound class to the unlimit-

ed. Snow will probably defend the 95 pound class for the locals while his brother, Ed Snow, will hold down the 135 pound class. Both of these lads are good and hope to come out on top. Baker, 105 pounds, and Cooper, 115 pound class, will fight the following bouts. Porter, 125 pounder, and Brouse, 155 pounds, are new-comers to the mat world but will make a good showing. Joe Gilbert, 145 pounder, J. Sutherland, 165 pound class, and N. Arthur, unlimited class, are all veterans of last year's championship team and fans can be assured that they will make a good showing.

The winning team will receive a bronze plaque. In individual matches, a gold medal will be awarded the winner, a silver medal for second place, while a bronze medal will be given in the consolation tourney. Over one hundred wrestlers are expected to enter the tournament.
