

Ogdensburg Free Academy Wrestlers Win Interscholastic Tournament

Gilbert's Victory Over Norwich Matman Breaks Tie, Gives OFA Victory

Van Hornesville Takes Second Place In Tourney With Eight Points — Cooper, Snow And Gilbert Of Ogdensburg Crowned As Interscholastic Champions

Canton — Like the Grecian wrestlers of Olympic fame, the Ogdensburg Free Academy grappling team that won the St. Lawrence University interscholastic tournament last year, came back to repeat and repeated.

It was Gilbert, solid-built little whirlwind of the Ogdensburg team, that gave his team the title. His aggressiveness in his match with Zeino of Norwich earned him the championship in the 145-pound class and gave Ogdensburg the three points it needed to beat Van Hornesville. Up till then the count of the two schools was knotted at 8-8.

The final team standing was: Ogdensburg, 11; Van Hornesville, 8; Norwich, 6; Ellenburg, 5; Little

Falls, 3.

The Ogdensburg champions crowned at the meet were: Cooper, 115-pound champion; E. Snow, 135-pounds; Gilbert, 145 pounds.

Ogdensburg was awarded the bronze wrestling plaque, the winning team. Medals were awarded to all first and second place winners, gold for first and silver for second. Only three falls were scored in the finals Saturday night. Cooper of Ogdensburg scored in the fastest time by throwing Eckler of Little Falls in 3.16 in the 115-pound class. Steckler of Van Hornesville in the 125 class and Trobley of Ellenburg Depot in the 105 class won by falls.

The wrestling was exceptionally good throughout the tournament in all classes. A new feature this year was the 95-pound class. Ivan of VanHornesville won this class in a time advantage of 5.32 most of this time he was aggressive and constantly endeavoring to score a fall.

Indianapolis — (AP) — Local Booster teams rolled again today in the American Bowling Congress after a weekend of heavy scoring by out-of-state teams which resulted in a general shakeup of the standings.

The Indiana Boosters will perform until Friday, when another contingent of bowlers from other states arrive.

New leaders appeared in each class in the tournament during the matches yesterday. Secord Drugs of Chicago won the lead in the team division with 2,896. In the two man event Ed Hanson and Russ Gersonde of Wauwatosa, Wis., moved into the top spot with 1,260.

Harlan Ingwalson, Rockford, Ill., accountant, produced the first 700 score of the tourney with games of 264, 236 and 202 for a 702 total and first place in the singles. He also soared to the top in the all events with a nine game aggregate of 1,880.
