

FIVE OF A BOYS QUALIFIED FOR SEMIFINALS

5 Schools Have 5 Men Each In Next To Final Round In Tournament

Canton — There was a mad scramble for first place in the third annual St. Lawrence University interscholastic wrestling tournament in which more than 100 grapplers were being tossed about the mat of Brewer Field House today in an effort to decide the winner.

Five schools each qualified five men for the semifinals to be held this afternoon. They are Little Falls, Norwich, VanHornsville, Ogdensburg, and Gouverneur.

The finals will be held tonight. The Ogdensburg Free Academy team, winner of the 1935 meet, is on hand with Coach Fred Klee-meier. Coach Wilbur Crip's Little Falls high school team, winner of the 1934 tourney and also winner of eight out of nine matches this season, is participating.

All but five of the grapplers taking part drew byes in the quarter finals. Results in the five qualifying matches held Friday afternoon are:

This afternoon three other Ogdensburg grapplers will tussle in the consolation group. John Cooper will meet Scott of Chateaugay in the 115 lb. division; Bob Snow will wrestle Gonier, Malone, in the 95 lb. group and Howard Brouse will meet Sessions, Malone, in the 155 lb. class.

Although Ogdensburg is one of five schools qualifying five men for the semi-finals, Coach Fred Kleemeier suffered a late handicap through an injury to Carl Wright who it was expected would win the 105 lb. title. Wright injured his arm in practice.
