# Canandaigua Nabs Class A Wrestling; Attica B Champs

Canandaigua Academy and Attica Central swept Section 5, Class A and Class B wrestling tournament championship honors, respectively, last night at Brockport State College.

Canandaigua, the Finger Lakes League champion, totaled 58 points to runnerup Corning East's 20 in Class A action while Attica, the Wyoming County champ, scored 36 points to second place Arcade's 26 in Class B.

Attica's Tim Embt, wrestling at the 115-pound level, hiked his unbeaten career streak to 57-0 over four years, 26-0 for this season, with a 22-0 decision over Caledonia-Mumford Greg Buckley for the Class B title and then pinned Class A champion Reggie Wilcox of Madison in 4:40 for the overall Section 5 championship.

Embt and all the other overall champions will represent Section-5 in this Friday and Saturday's Intersectionals at the Onondaga County War Memorial in Syracuse.

East Rochester's Jim Tortorici took the overall title at 123 with a 5:12 pin of Avon's Randy Stephenson, the Class B winner,

after Tortorici decided Webster's Fred Pearce, 7-1, for the Class A title.

The win was Tortorici's 24th of the season without a loss and upped his career record to 70-1, the only loss resulting from a pin in his sophomore year.

Embt and Tortorici were the only defending champions to repeat.

Other overall champions who completed unbeaten seasons were Carmen Olivares (15-0) of East High at 106, Greg Fuller (14-0) of West at 141, Gary Harvey (21-0) of Fairport at 168 and Ernie DiBella (23-0) of Pittsford at 183.

Two other defending champs were beaten in the overall clashes between Class A and Class B winners.

Pen Sheldon of Victor won the 133-pound Class B crown but lost to Steve Achilles of East-ridge for the overall title.

Bill Simpson of Mynderse Academy lost to Ernie DiBella of Pittsford for the Class A title.

The win was Hobart's eighth against nine defeats while Harpur dropped its eighth against five wins.

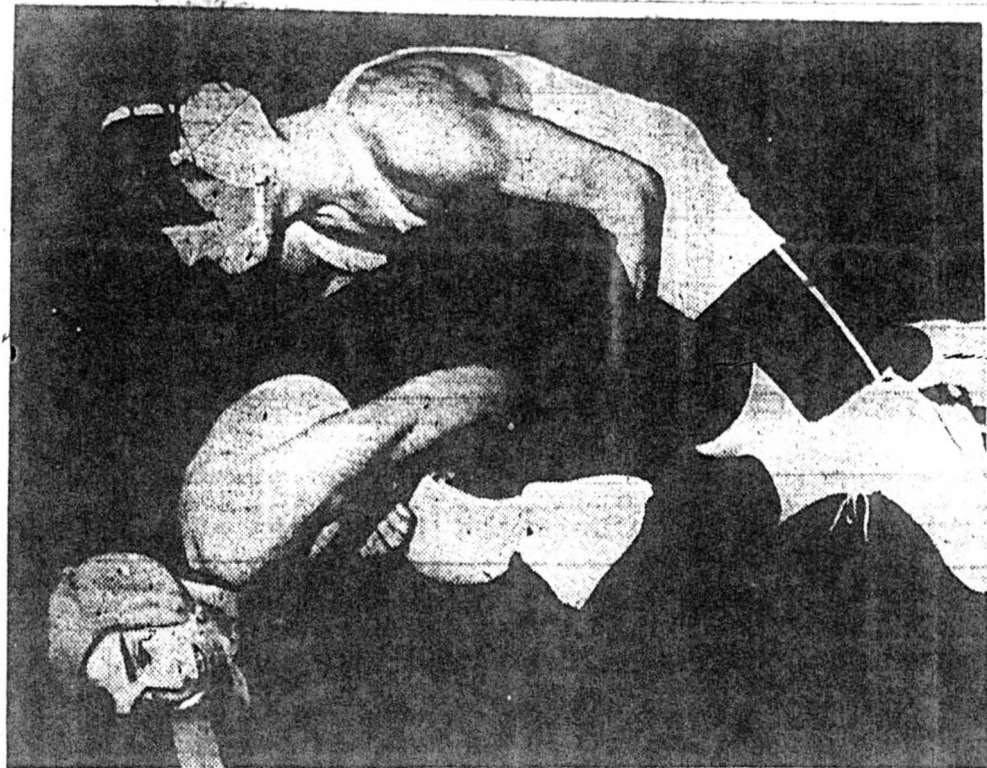

Harpur led three times in the first half but trailed, 36-32, at halftime.

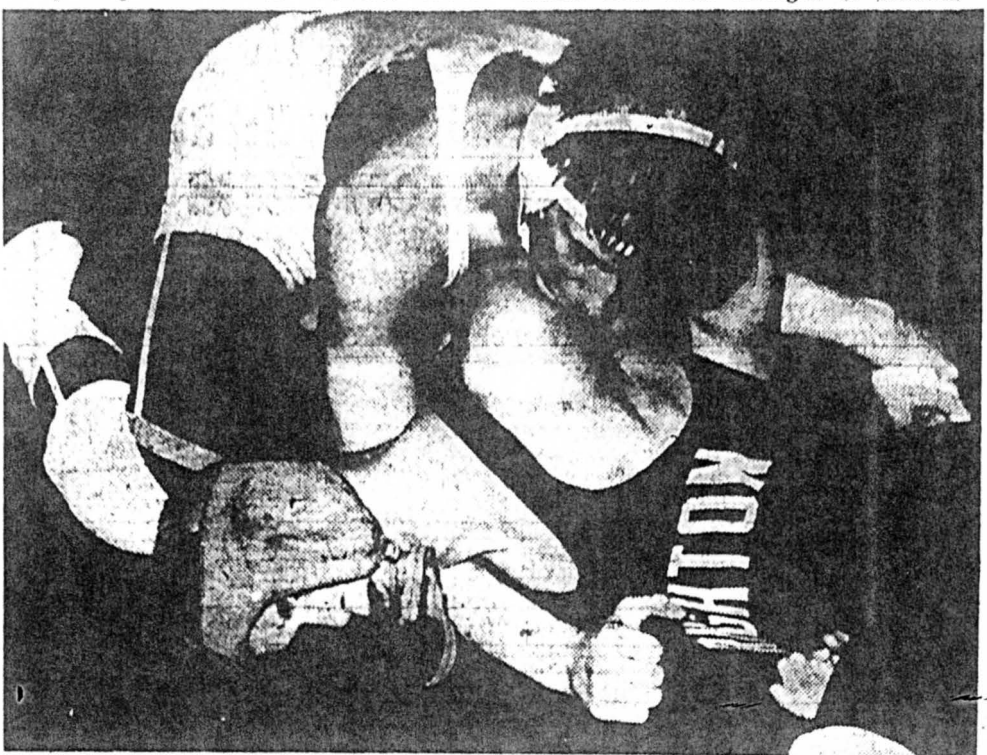
The visitors had the ball with 13 seconds left to play but were unable to tie the score.
