Miller makes history, has 5 sectional titles

Tonawanda's Guy Miller has had a habit of rewriting the local wrestling record books, but Saturday he set a New York State milestone by becoming the first high school grappler to win five Sectional titles as he took the 138-pound final at the Section VI Division III wrestling tournament, held at Tonawanda.

His undefeated Warrior team had to settle for second place, however,

as a powerful Iroquois contingency racked up 220 points and took five first place finishes away from Tonawanda wrestlers.

Miller began his varsity career while in the eighth grade, at the 91-pound level. He won his initial Sectional title, and proceeded to add championships at the 105, 112 and 119-pound plateaus.

This year, he became the first Warrior to

surpass the century mark in wins, as he finished his dual meet career with 101 victories.

Miller was one of Tonawanda's two winners on the night, the other being Mike Richmond (215), who scored a 19-8 decision over Jerry Grisko of Williamsville East.

Iroquois picked up its first sectional title since 1968.

The Chiefs, who only last Wednesday wrapped

up the ECIC Division II title, were led by winners: Matt Lewis-Jones (98), Bob Sluberski (105), John Hannah (126), Pat Malay (145), Ron Planter (155), Scott Slade (167) and Frank Terranova (250). Terranova scored the night's quickest pin over Lew-Port's Chuck Dillon, in 53 seconds.

Sweet Home is winner

Sweet Home overpowered a strong field on Saturday to capture its second consecutive Section VI Division I wrestling championship at Kenmore East High School.

The Panthers took five title matches en route to scoring 159½ points. Jamestown finished second at 141½. Kenmore East, in fourth place, was the top Niagara Frontier League team, with 98 points.

Defending sectional champions John McHugh (105), Paul Reed (132) and Cedric Hinton (177) won three of Sweet Home's six matches. McHugh pinned Jamestown's Jeff Fitzpatrick in 5:22. Craig

Weber (91), Bob Vogel (145) and Meltzer Wilkins (112) rounded out the Panther attack.

Pat Mooney of Lancaster and Dan Moran of Jamestown were also repeat sectional winners.

Chris Moree of Kenmore East was chosen as the meet's outstanding wrestler. The 119-pounder decided a rugged Matt Monin of Lancaster, 6-4.

At the 167 plateau, Doug Miller of Kenmore East outpointed Kenmore West's Tom Novo, 9-4. Bulldogs Bob Brandell (145) and Jeff Borders (250) also made it to the final competition, but fell to decision losses.

North Tonawanda's Mike Jacobi (91) dropped

a 14-4 match to Sweet Home's Weber. Jack Snitzer, Kenmore West's 126-pound entry, lost 11-3 to Mike Carney of Jamestown.

Kenmore West finished in sixth place with 55 points and North Tonawanda took eighth with 38.

Winners and runners-up in each weight class, from all eight divisions, will advance to the New York State Inter-Sectional Qualifier next Friday and Saturday at Sweet Home.

The amazing Miller also picked up the outstanding wrestler award for the competition.

DeLorenzo mat champ

Glen DeLorenzo of Niagara-Wheatfield emerged as the only Niagara Frontier League champion in the Section VI Division II wrestling tournament held Saturday at Niagara-Wheatfield.

It was a tough day for the local schools as Wheatfield, Lockport and

LaSalle finished at the bottom of the eight school event.

DeLorenzo (105) picked up a 9-6 decision over Bob Franz of Hamburg.

Orchard Park was the overall winner, dethroning defending champion Hamburg, for its first title in over 20 years. The Quakers

racked up 174 points, while Hamburg was a distant second with 132½.

Orchard Park crowned five individual champs in the day-long affair. Lockport's Mike Mullen (112) and John Whalen (132) lost in the finals as did LaSalle's Chris Mitchell (126) and Duane Hunt (177). Falcon Mark Oakey was pinned at the 138-pound level.
