Bomber Wrestling Record Goes To 3-0 With Victory

A 11-3 win by 177 pounder Rick Sidor in the semifinal match insured a third successive victory for Coach Don Quinn's undefeated East Rochester High School wrestling team last Thursday night over McQuaid.

Sidor, a junior, took to the mats with the Bombers in front 22-19 following a five-point superior decision by John Zito over rival Lem Rogers in the previous scrap that put ER in front. Zito racked up an easy 13-0 win in the 167 pound division.

Sidor pocketed four points in a major decision over Vince Baimonte with a 11-3 nod.

In the finale, the Bomber margin ran to 29-19 as Joe Baldo decisioned Phil Lanzatella 8-3 in the 215 weights.

It followed the script of the previous two dual matches won by the Bombers over Irondequoit and Webster Schroeder, Monroe County Eastern Division foes. East Rochester clinched the verdicts in the windup tussles.

And Mike Brien continued to stay unbeaten by posting an opening match pin in a fast :40 seconds over Tom Green, in the 98 pound class.

McQuaid tied the match at 6-6 as 105 pounder Steve Nally pinned ER's Pat Zito in 3:15.

McQuaid moved into a 10-6 lead as Bomber Curtiss Doreen lost a major 4-point decision by a 12-2 count to Rob Starkweather in the 112 division.

Romeo Battazzi edged ER within a point of McQuaid by

taking a 7-3 nod over John Scott in the 119 class and 126 pounder Jeff Kier rolled the Bombers into a 12-10 lead on a 7-2 victory over Timmy Scheg.

Quinn's club fell behind again as Paul Nesser's 11-3 victory over ER's Dave Yacona in the 132 class netted a two point lead for the home matmen.

Bob Marianetti just edged McQuaid's Tom Bayer, 10-9 in the 138 class to nudge the Combers ahead again, 15-14 and 145 pounder Dave Prong muscled the McQuaid grappler, George Moore to a 2-2 tie to put two points in each team's score card.

Then came Zito, Sidor and Baldo and ER cinched the win.

Quinn's club continued to wade into rough competition this week, displaying its talents in the Monroe County Tournament at Webster Schroeder Tuesday and Wednesday; traveling to Baldwinsville for that team's Christmas Tournament Friday; and continuing their away action next Wednesday night at Canandaigua, a perennial Finger Lakes area power.
