**SEEDINGS MEETING**  
**FALCONER** — The seeding meeting for the Class A Section VI wrestling tournament will be held at Falconer Wednesday, 7:30, according to tourney chairman Dan Lounsbury.

Lounsbury has announced admission for the three sessions at 75 cents for everyone.

Jim Lucey of Bemus Point and Joe Annarella of Sinclairville are two of the officials already named. The matches will be contested on two polvomite sponge rubber mats. They'll start at 7 p.m. Friday, 1 p.m. Saturday with consolations 7 p.m. Saturday and finals 8 p.m. the same day.

A rundown on the entries:  
**ECIC Teams**

Alden, Depew, Eden and Springville are entered from the Erie County Interscholastic Conference. Depew was fourth last year, Eden sixth and Alden eighth. Springville has dropped down a notch from Class AA.

Back from Alden are Ron Heist (115) and Robert Krauss (157). Heist was third in 106 last year while Krauss lost in the 157 finals. Gene Snyder, 148 pounder claims a 154 record.

Eden's Dan Cagwin, beaten in the semi's by Jerry Todaro of Southwestern last year, looks like a good heavyweight bet. Depew is considerably weaker than last year and Springville was beaten by Gowanda earlier, 29-22.

But Depew does return Jim Werts, 148 finalist last year who carries a 12-0-2 record into the 157 competition. Springville's best is Mike Sebzda, another 157 pounder.

**From Niagara-Orleans**

Starpoint's the team to be reckoned with here, although Royalton-Hartland and Albion are also entered. For Albion it's the first time in sectional competition.

Jim Ellis of Starpoint was beaten by Tom Todaro in the finals last year. He's in 115 this year. Bob O'Malley, fourth-ranked 130 pounder beaten out by Gary Olson of SWCS last year, returns in that class.

Joe Monkelbaan was seeded fourth last season, but knocked off in the first round by Paul Donner. He'll again be in Donner's weight class, 141. John Hey, top seeded in 148 but knocked off early last year, will try it in 157, coming in with 10-0 mark.

**Tier Hopfuls**

Southwestern leads the area teams, although host Falconer could fare very well. The Trojans were runners-up to Medina last year (now Class AA). Falconer was seventh.

Salamanca and Gowanda have boys shooting for individual honors. Best bets for the Sallies are Bob "Hayseed" Harris, third last year, and 98 pounder Darrell Gilman (10-5). Gowanda has only Ken Phillips, 14-1 in the 130 pound class.

Falconer looks to a trio of strongboys for top honors. Ricky Cannon's been beaten only once in the 136 field, Chuck Butman claims a lone loss in 157 and Wayne Silvernail, defending unlimited champ, has lost twice.

Southwestern proudly boasts 98 pound Lee Christiansen (9-1), 106 Ed Strom (11-0), 115 former champion Jerry Holmes (10-0-1), 123 Tom Todaro (8-2), 141 Paul Donner (6-3-2), 157 Mike Coon (7-2), 183 Krifty Swan (9-1-1) and unlimited runner-up Ron Borst (9-2).

**Congratulations** to Byron Clark who was elected president of the Chautauqua County Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs during the recent meeting. Ernie Billquist was named vice-president and Harold Wolfe continues as secretary-treasurer.

During the meeting Conservation Officer Don Malmrose pointed out that a quirk in the calendar (it happens every 10 years) will give hunters a three week deer season this fall. The Department has not acted on changing this yet.

The Federation delegates were instructed to have their individual member clubs vote on the proposed resolution that our hunting and fishing seasons open on Saturday. The resolution will be discussed further at the next meeting when delegates report on how the clubs vote.

The Chautauqua County Winter Skeet League, in its third year of action, has developed into a highly-competitive circuit among local shooters.

Originally developed as a 25 bird fun league — something to do during the winter — it now commands the whole-hearted support of the four Chautauqua County skeet clubs — Mayville, Falconer, Celoron and Jamestown.
