

# AA title to Canandaigua ★

Canandaigua captured eight individual titles last night and also walked away with the Section 5 Class AA wrestling championships at Community College of the Finger Lakes in Canandaigua.

The Braves, ranked second in the state, easily won the team title with 263 points. Brockport was second with 136 and Newark third with 105½.

Brockport's only individual winner was Todd Buenting at 148 pounds. He decisioned Mike Reho of Canandaigua, 9-5. The only other local wrestler to win a title was Rick Kase of Pittsford Mendon at 158. He recorded a 5-3 decision over Ralph Matsko of Brockport.

Newark heavyweight Bob Button captured his fourth straight heavyweight title, pinning Charlie Groves of Brockport in 1:51.

Brockport's Tom Brown also was a runner-up at 132. He was pinned by

Canandaigua's Matt King with 21 seconds left.

**MORE WRESTLING:** Host East Rochester captured the Class A title with 214 points. Mynderse Academy was second with 123.

The Bombers had individual winners in Tom Pagano at 108 pounds, Mike Kuhn (129), Romeo Battazzi (135), Joe Walczyk (141) and Craig Vennette (148).

Pagano recorded a 2-0 decision over Dave Gastrau of Sodus. Kuhn decisioned Buzzy Lawson of Waterloo, 18-6. Battazzi crushed Mike Briggs of Wellsville, 15-2. Walczyk beat Dom Caracillo of Mynderse, 5-3, and Vennette recorded a 12-3 decision against Paul Hibsch of Attica.

East Rochester's runners-up were Mark Rosati at 94, Scott McIntosh (115) and Frank Arnold (122).

Paul Richard of Geneseo captured his fourth straight Section 5 Class B individual title at Geneseo High School.

Richard pinned Tim MacDonald of Caledonia-Mumford in 1:21 at 141 pounds.

Geneseo won the team championship, its second in four years, with a total of 144½ points. Kendall finished second with 116 and Avon was third with 108½.

Geneseo also had individual winners at 135 pounds, where Rob DiFranco recorded a pin in 3:49, and at 148, where Don Carman won a 3-2 decision over Chris Phillips of Avon.

Kendall had winners in Stu McFarland (170), who won a 21-2 decision over Doug Clements of Cal-Mum, and Wayne Martin (180), who decisioned John Bookmiller of Letchworth, 7-3.
