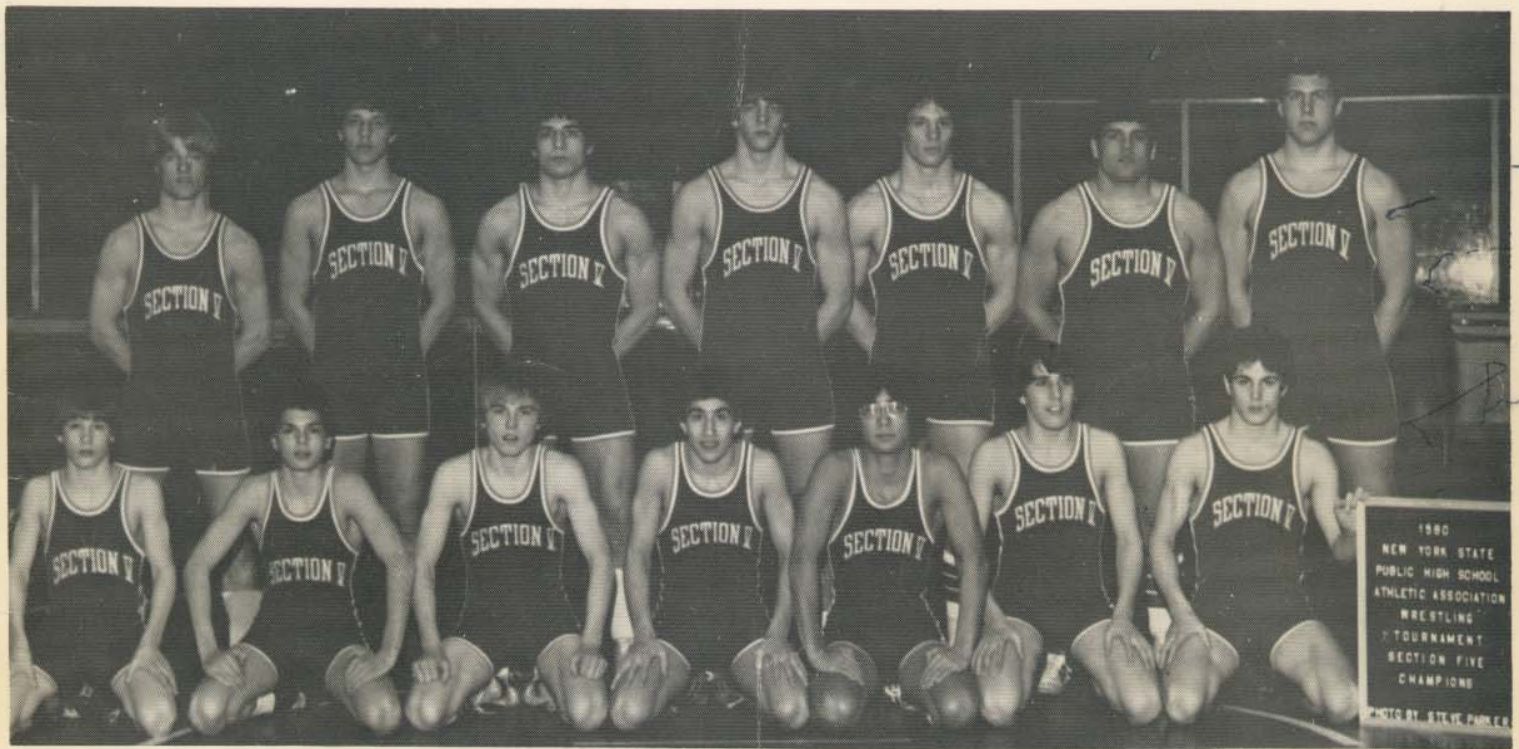

TOURNAMENT BRACKET-CHANGE

WRESTLING IN SECTION V HAS UNDERGONE MANY CHANGES IN THE PAST DECADE IN AN ATTEMPT TO IMPROVE THE SPORT FOR WRESTLERS AND FANS. UPON THE URGING OF MANY COACHES, THE SECTION V WRESTLING COMMITTEE HAS ADOPTED THE CONCEPT OF A DOUBLE ELIMINATION TOURNAMENT. TO QUALIFY FOR THE NEW YORK STATE INTERSECTIONAL TOURNAMENT IN SYRACUSE, NEW YORK.

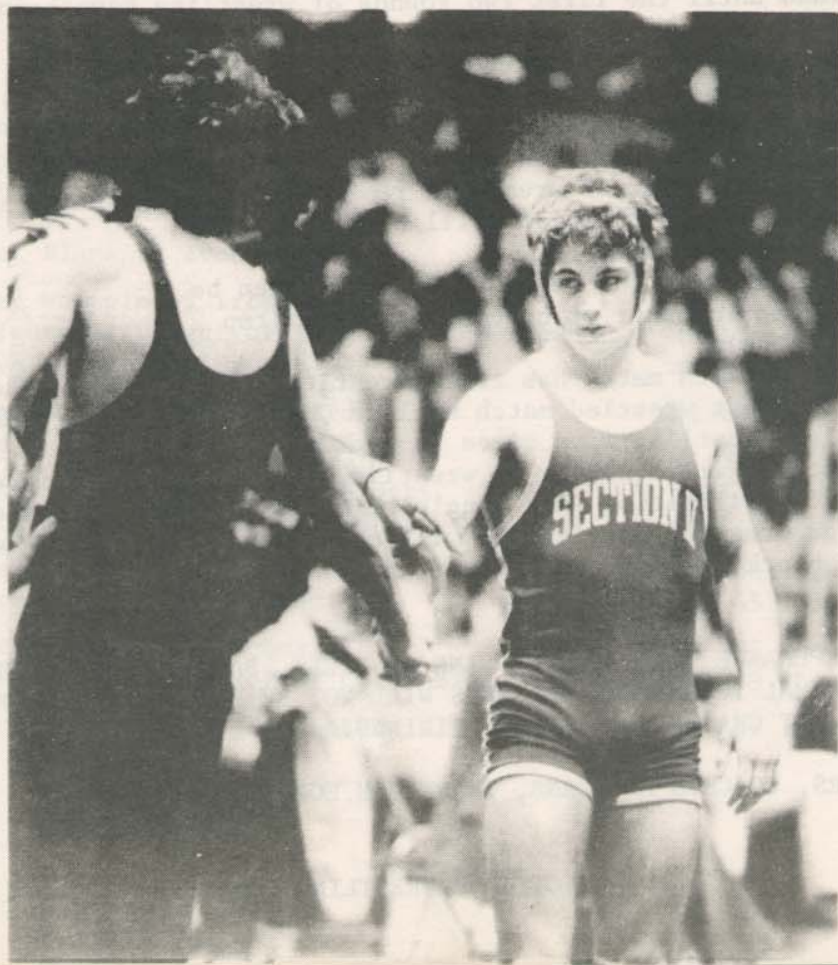
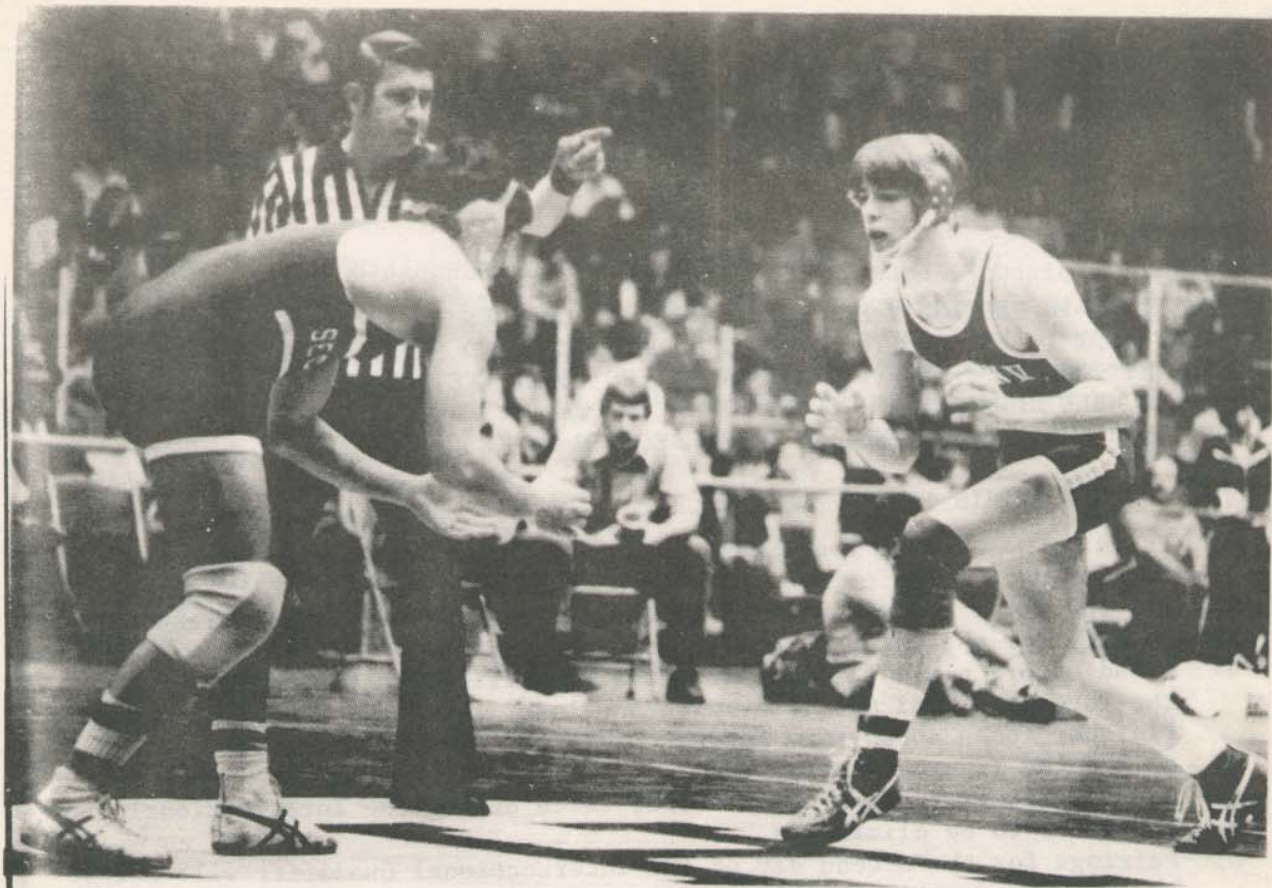
THE RULES FOR THIS TOURNAMENT ARE:

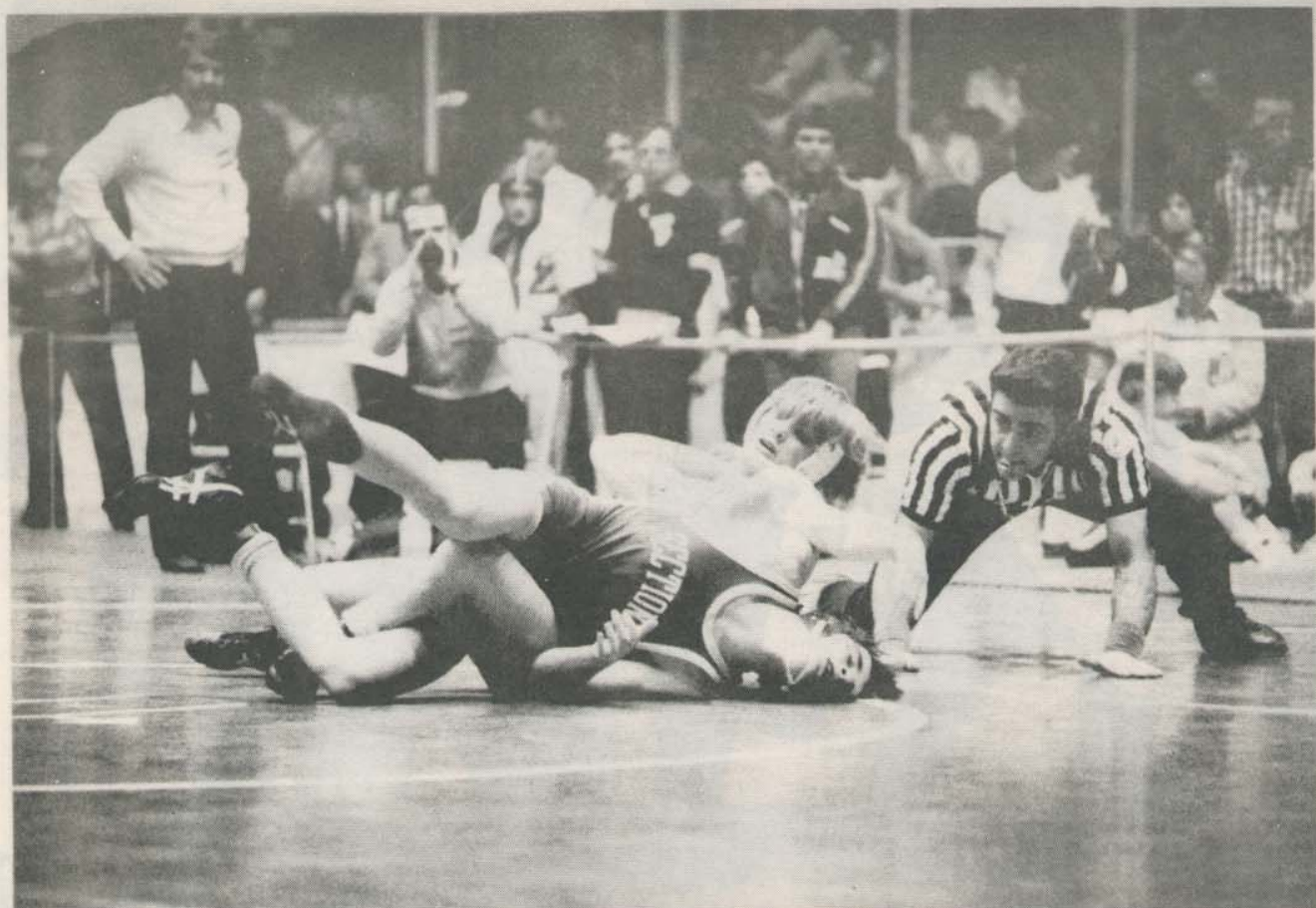
1. It is a two weekend Tournament, beginning with the classification tournament.
2. The top three place finishers from each classification tournament qualify for the Intersectional Qualifier.
3. A 2nd or 3rd place finisher from the classification tournament enters the Intersectional Qualifier with one loss, thus if a 2nd or 3rd place finisher loses at anytime during the Intersectional Qualifier, he is eliminated from the tournament.
4. A classification champion must lose twice during the Intersectional Qualifier to be eliminated.
5. Pairings for the second day of the Intersectional Qualifier will not be determined until the first two rounds of wrestling have been completed. The pairings for the second day will be determined by the wrestling committee using the following as a guide:
 - a. Any classification champion losing the first round or second round will be listed at the top of the bracket.
 - b. If an odd number of wrestlers remains, non-classification champions will be paired as much as is reasonable.
 - c. The winners of the second round will then be inserted in order of bracket read-out (top to bottom).
6. In the event a fifth match has to be wrestled, it will not. The winner of the last wrestled match will be CHAMPION. (This refers to a wrestler wrestling five times in one day.)
7. At large entrees will qualify by wrestling the 3rd place finisher from their classification in a single elimination round. Should the at large wrestler qualify, he will then assume the 3rd place finisher's bracket place and one automatic loss.

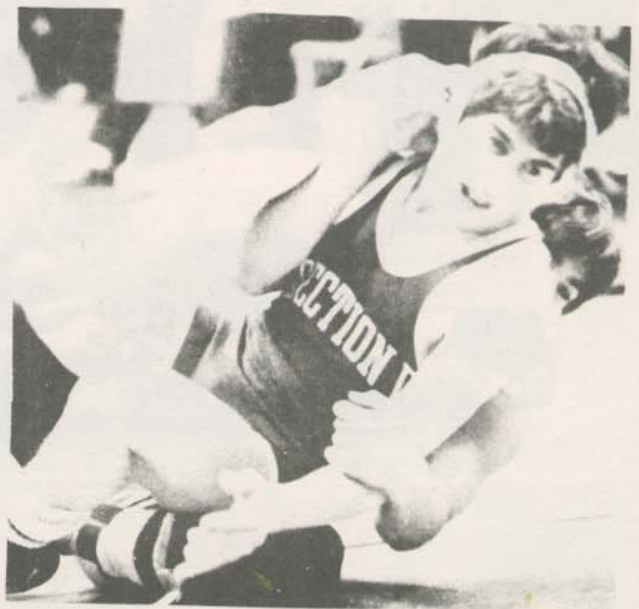

HOW TO WATCH WRESTLING

WHAT'S HAPPENING:

- FIRST: Both wrestlers come forward to the center of the mat and shake hands.
- NEXT: The referee blows his whistle and signals "wrestle".
- NOW: Each wrestler is trying to get his opponent off of his feet and wind up on top of or behind him in control - this is a "TAKEDOWN".
- POINTS: The first points are likely to be given for a takedown.
- THEN: The defensive (bottom man) wrestler is trying to escape (get away) or reverse his position to get on top or behind his opponent. The offensive (usually the top man) wrestler is trying to get a hold with which he can keep his opponent's shoulders on the mat for two seconds - a PIN.

Each match has three periods which are two minutes long.

- FIRST PERIOD: Starts from the standing position.
- SECOND PERIOD: Starts from the referee's position. One wrestler in the top position and the other wrestler in the down position.
- THIRD PERIOD: Starts with the position at the start of the second period reversed.

ANYTIME A PIN OCCURS - THE MATCH IS ENDED

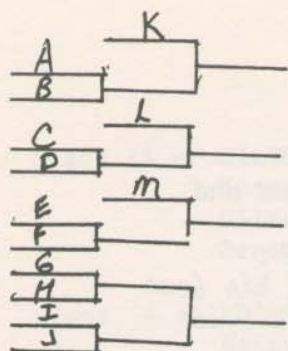
INDIVIDUAL SCORING:

- Takedown.....2 points
- Escape.....1 point
- Reversal.....2 points
- Near Fall.....2 points or 3 points
- Penalties.....1 point for first and second offense
2 points for third offense
