On Feb. 8 our wrestlers defeated Letchworth 31-22. John Halpenny started us out in fine shape with an 8-0 decision win. Dan Willett came up next with a great pin in 1:12. Russell Rawleigh (7-6) and Bill Buckley (5-1) scored two consecutive three point decisions. Keith Mehlenbacher, however, really put it to his opponent with a 13-2 win. We then finished it off with two pins. Dewight Cartwright pinned his man in 3:55 and Bob LeClair did it in 4:49. It was a good match.

Next our wrestlers walked on the mats to beat Mt. Morris. Although Mt. Morris's wrestlers are good they don't have enough for a team. They were forced to forfeit to our John Halpenny, Dan Willett, Pat Smith, Bert Boss and Robert LeClair. The rest of our team had to work for their points. Keith Mehlenbacher stacked up 9 points to his opponent's 2. Then we had three fantastic pins one after another. Starting us out was LaVergne Cartwright, although he had the longest time by mere seconds it took him only 3:19. Phil Piper followed suit with the shortest pin in 1:56. Don Coon controlled his man and had him pinned in 3:11.

On the 25th of February our wrestlers competed in the Livingston County Wrestlers tournament. John Halpenny, one of our most promising wrestlers, couldn't beat Geneseo's "Super Soph" Andy Lipson but will go to Sectionals anyway. John was ceded for 2d and finished second. He won his first match by pin and lost his next one to Lipson (5-0). Keith Mehlenbacher won his first match by decision but then lost to Greer who was ceded 2d. Donny Coon took his first opponent by a pin in 3:36, however, Ziarkowski who was ceded 2d proved to be too much for him. Pat Smith beat his first rival by a pin in 1:29. His next match was against Harmon who finished in first place. Dewight Cartwright took first place in the 177 class with three consecutive pins. His first pin was a quickie in just 32 seconds, he followed that with a pin in 1:52. For his final match he pinned Sunderland, who was ceded 3d in 1:06. As a team we tied in

number seven with LeRoy. Caledonia-Mumford took first place.
