

Athletic Letters and Awards Presented at School Ceremony

In a colorful presentation ceremony held at school assembly Tuesday afternoon, rewards for accomplishments in athletics were passed out to boys and girls who won letters and certificates for participation in the school athletic program. In the boys' division, 82 letters were awarded to 40 different boys among the 58 who took part in the interscholastic athletic program. The number participating represents more than half of the boys' enrollment in high school.

Carnival Will Have Fireworks

Perry firemen have received permission for a display of fireworks at the carnival on Thursday evening, June 24. The ban on fireworks has curbed Fourth of July celebrations for so long that this event will be the first opportunity many young people have ever had to see them. The showing will include both aerial and ground displays.

The usual number of booths, games and other features will be provided to insure continuous entertainment for those who attend each evening that the carnival is in session, June 22 to 26, and Saturday afternoon. Wednesday night the big parade of visiting firemen will be held, and Saturday afternoon is slated for children's day. The Three Barretts, sensational high-tower acrobats, will give a free performance each night and Saturday afternoon.

A baseball novelty is in prospect for Perry fans next Monday night, June 14, when the Perry Red Sox will play the famous Washington Pilots, professional colored team. The game will be played at the village park under the lights. The visitors carry their own lighting equipment.

The Cuban Giants were rated on a par with major league teams and it was only when they needed a run or two that they quit clowning. The Washington Pilots are expected to show a big-league brand of baseball.

Covers Wide Range

A new policy instituted this year permitted athletes to take part in only one major sport at a time. The policy was designed to spread participation over a larger group altho it was realized that it might have the effect of lowering the standard of some teams. However, the value of athletic training to a larger number more than offset any disadvantage of the policy in the opinion of the school officials and the result was greater interest in the entire athletic program.

In the girls' athletic program, 54 participated in basketball, 38 in volleyball, 40 in bowling, 21 in tennis and 25 in softball. In volleyball, the Juniors emerged as champions while the Seniors and Sophs tied for second place. 24 games were rolled in the bowling tournament, won by the team captained by Norma McDonald.
