

EAST'S MAT STARS DROP IN TOURNEY

Oklahoma Wrestlers Have Edge on Field for Finals Today

State College, Pa., March 28.—A crew of heavy muscled youngsters from points West and South took good firm holds on the prime college wrestlers of the East tonight and all but swept them from the annual National Collegiate Association tournament.

Out of a field of over 90 agile youths, many of them from the leading colleges of the East, only two from New England remained in the running for championships in eight classes after 46 preliminary bouts that turned the spacious gym at Penn State into a whirling panorama of arms and legs and flying bodies during the hectic acrimaging of the opening day. There were two more from the South, the remains of the Virginia Military Institute entry, while all the rest came from points West—mostly Oklahoma.

Battling neck and neck for the team title, the grapplers of Oklahoma University and Oklahoma Aggies between them grabbed nine of the 32 places in the semi-finals to be staged here tomorrow afternoon. The University had a slight edge on the Aggies, five to four, and are favored to win the crown the southwest farmer boys are defending.

Three champions came through in successful defense of their titles. Joe Sepora, of Illinois, leading the way in the 115-pound class while Lawrence Mantooth of Oklahoma University found ordinary opposition among the 176 pounders and Earl McCready unlimited class title holder, from the Oklahoma Aggies, scored a quick fall to win his only bout.

Not a single upset occurred in preliminary rounds of the interscholastic wrestling tournament Monday and Tuesday; but four upsets, and all major ones, adequately made up for the former dearth when school grapplers ran off the finals last night at Tech.

Biggest surprise of the night was outcome of the match between Francis Spronza, Tech, and James Gala, West, in the 126-135-pound class. Gala had the honor of administering the second beating that the shop school star has suffered in the last two years when he won his bout on a time advantage of 44 seconds after two extra periods.

Tech High grapplers copped the majority of honors, five city champions, to their credit. East came next with three, while West finished last with one. Last season the shopmen scored in four events, East in three, West in one, and Charlotte in one.

An overflow crowd packed the Tech gymnasium to witness the event.
