Class "B" tournament Kevin pinned a strong Bill Mallabar of Nunda in the semifinals. This set the stage for the "big battle" of the tournament. Richie Roth of Caledonia, undefeated, who had pinned Kevin in an earlier meeting, was his opponent in the finals. In a match that kept the fans on their feet, the Livonian defeated a fighting Roth, 2-0.

In the quarterfinals of Section V, Kevin quickly brought an end to Monroe County's champion's hopes by pinning him early in the second period. With the same confident, aggressive wrestling, he disposed of Jim Woodruff, the Allegeny-Steuben champion, in the semifinals.

Kevin's opponent in the finals was Willie Howell of Lydonville, who finished second in last year's sectionals and was unbeaten this year. Although Howell wrestled a hard aggressive match, a determined Masterson held off his bid and defeated him 2-0.

Tony Backus, who has been undefeated in two years of dual meet competition, finished second in Class B and fourth in Section V. Tony, a two time county champion, has lost only three matches out of his last 43 and holds the Livonia record of consecutive wins. In the semifinals, Saturday, he defeated the champion of Allegheny and Steuben counties which is made up of 18 schools. In the finals, Tony, met Gene Sheldon of Victor, who has been sectional champion for the past two years. In a match that could have gone either way, he was defeated 2-0. Tony, only a junior, will be back next year to win the crown.

John Durkee finished eighth in the heavyweight class. John, who has been a mainstay of the Livonia wrestlers, was handicapped by a severe sprained ankle. John won the county title in Class "B" and defeated the Monroe County champion.
