

Defending champs roll at SuperSectional meet

Two defending champions, including the defending state champion, remained alive after the first day of the Section V Wrestling SuperSectional state qualifier last night at Webster Schroeder Junior High School.

Wayland-Cohocton freshman Tim Page, the defending Section V and state champion at 91 pounds, easily captured his first-round match at 96 pounds. He won by a technical fall for his 100th career victory.

Spencerport's Jason DeBruin, another defending sectional champion, needed only 35 seconds to pin his first-round match against Ian Boxhorn of Attica at 135 pounds. Among other highlights during the first day of action:

ons led the 112-pound weight class. Warsaw's Charlie Voorhees, runner-up in the '95 state tournament, and Ashley-John Grillo of Holley remain in contention. Both wrestlers are on opposite sides of the bracket and won early first-round matches, needing only two wins to meet in tonight's final.

■ Besides Page, two 140-pound wrestlers also reached 100 career wins. Don Carlo-Clauss (Greece Olympia) and Kevin Suhr (Victor) won to set up a quarterfinal match-up.

Quarterfinal matches begin this morning at 11 a.m.

The semifinals are scheduled for 2 p.m., third-place matches at 4 p.m., and finals for 7 p.m. □
