## JCC Plays Monroe Here Tonite

Jamestown Community College takes aim for a split on the season here tonight, going up against Monroe C.C., 14-6 entering the game.

The Rochester area junior college all but annihilated the Muskies in the road portion of the home-and-home series. Hitting on 50 per cent of their 62 attempts, Monroe racked up an 80-47 margin over the Bataitismen.

Since then they've received and accepted a Region Three JUCO bid, joining a field that also includes Muskie rival Alfred Tech.

Coach George Bataitis and crew look for a fast-breaking game again, and expect to see a tough Monroe zone on offense. Len Johnson was the high scorer in the first game with 18 points, although four others also hit twin figures. Johnson currently leads the squad, averaging 13.7.

This is a crack cage club averaging 82.2 points per game on offense, while holding its opposition to 64.9 on defense. Both marks rank in the top five among the region's junior schools.

Going against the invaders are Bataitis' starting five of Rog Erickson and Dave Smith up front, Terry Olofson at center and Vic Lipinski and Tom Terwilliger.

The Muskies, closing out the 1963-64 season, will also be trying to halt a four-game losing streak to get the coming season off with a clean bill of health.

**Questions Answered**  
These and several other questions should receive a positive answer Saturday when the Section VI Inter-sectional wrestling meet takes place at Erie County Tech.

Sixteen boys will be entering from the Southern Tier Conference and Jamestown High, furnishing nearly one third of the competition in this first-attempted affair. Of the 16, six will go in without a loss.

The winners here travel to Long Island where they'll compete in the state competition, made up of wrestlers from various sections in the state. This is the first year Section VI is entering the competition, which was held at Cornell last year.

**Best Bets**  
With 16 boys entering in the action, the area can't help but have one winner at least. Who are the best bets?

Well, you have to go with a winner, and the six unbeaten grapplers should be in the thick of things. Stankey, a Pine Valley product, should receive some very stiff opposition from Nick Kish of Amherst. Kish hasn't lost since the first match of his sophomore year, going through 54 straight opponents.

The 106 competition should be something with Tom Todaro, of Southwestern, Bert Nagel of Cattaraugus, Mike Cunningham of Niagara Falls and Ron Rudich of Iroquois all blended well. Nagel, unbeaten, was the only man to pin Todaro. Cunningham was named top wrestler in the Triple-A affair while Rudich is a stalwart for Iroquois, the team with more than 100 straight wins.

**Lefford Could Beat**  
The 136 contention could possibly bring home a winner in Falconer's Gary Lefford. Lefford, no surprise at the A meet, could meet either of two underdogs in Dick Acquila, non-seeded in the Triple-A's or Mark Kiesling, a surprise in Double-A competition. Kiesling was named his class' outstanding wrestler. Thrown in for good measure is Randolph's once-beaten Bruce Schapp.

The 115-pounders tangling again are Wayne Miller of Gowanda and Dan Evans of Cattaraugus. Miller halted a 33-meet win streak of Evans' in their first outing and the Big Red ace will definitely seek revenge.

Jamestown High star Jim Stockwell won't be worried about two of his rivals, but the third could easily outweigh almost two of him. He's Frank Patterson of Niagara - Wheatfield, a winner by forfeit in almost every match he's entered. The big fellow goes about 390, but on his back it should be dead weight. At least that's what Stockwell will be counting on.
